T-4 Sexual Predators on Parole

Presented by Parole Agents Steve Reinhart and Marvin Cooper of the California Department of Corrections & Rehabilitation

The California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation, Division of Adult Parole Operations has been utilizing the Global Positioning System (GPS) on paroled sex offenders since June 2005. In December 2008, the department successfully succeeded in placing all parolees required to register pursuant to Penal Code Section 290 on GPS supervision. At the current time we lead the nation in the utilization of GPS with over 7000 paroled offenders on GPS. The Electronic Monitoring Unit within the department serves as Subject Matter Experts in the field of GPS and provides all training to field staff as it relates to any Electronic Monitoring.

During this presentation two of the Electronic Monitoring Unit's Subject Matter Experts (SME) will present an overview of the unit, goals, how we arrived to where we are today, current GPS numbers, crime scene correlation and a brief review of the how the GPS tracks are played by the Agents and what information they are looking for. This review will be an actual case where the offender was convicted of a crime on GPS data alone.

Presented by: Lt. Michelle Richards and Officer Joe Witty, Los Angeles Police Department

A Multiple Attack Counter Terrorism Action Capability (MACTAC) incident is identified as multiple deadly force incidents that occur simultaneously or a terrorist attack involving explosives and/or high powered weapons, or a hostage siege where the armed persons have used deadly force on other persons and the situation is ongoing and dynamic. Conventional law enforcement tactics may be inadequate when a MACTAC incident occurs.

MACTAC tactics are an expansion of Officer Rapid Deployment or Immediate Action Rapid Deployment tactics. Modeled after military small unit tactics, officers are trained to immediately respond in a variety of tactical configurations to stop or interrupt the deadly actions of the assailants, establish on-scene command; gather and disseminate intelligence for situational awareness, establish perimeter control, and protect vital facilities.
