**\$44.8 MILLION TO BUILD & EXPAND 11 EAST L.A. CLINICS**

As the economy struggles to get out of recession, people rely on L.A. County's health care and social services safety net more than ever. That's why our office insisted on spending \$44.8 million in one-time county health care funds specifically to build or expand clinics in regions that need them most. As a result, East L.A. will get \$7.3 million for four new clinics and seven expanded clinics. The San Gabriel Valley will receive \$12.2 million for six new clinics, one new school-based clinic, and eight expanded clinics. Southeast and South L.A. will get \$15.4 million for three new clinics, six new school-based clinics, and 14 expanded clinics! When our office first proposed spending new dollars to help L.A. County residents without health insurance, we were told this would be impossible in a time of budget crisis. But a budget crisis is exactly when we must take care of our most vulnerable residents - and it's the reason why our office resolved to make these health care funds a reality.



**COMPLETED GREENWAY BRIGHTENS VALINDA AVE.**



We're adding more greenery to unincorporated Valinda --especially in known graffiti hot pots. That's why we invested \$1.1 million to plant vines, shrubs, and trees along Valinda Ave. beginning on Amar Rd., crossing Mulvane St., and ending at Puente Creek. Recently, we continued this landscaping project down Valinda Ave. between Wing Ln. and Mulvane St. The new greenway features curved bands of native plants growing alongside a granite trail and an evergreen hedge stretching down the pathway as it abuts adjacent homes. We hope this picturesque pathway gives Valinda residents the opportunity to enjoy the outdoors a little more and even get some exercise -- especially since we recently installed new fitness equipment at nearby Rimgrove Park, just one block away from where this lush, new greenway ends.

## VANDALISM ENFORCEMENT TEAM NETS 312 ARRESTS IN '09

Last year was a bad one for vandals and taggers targeting the Pico Rivera, West Whittier, and South Whittier neighborhoods! Our office partnered with personnel from the Sheriff's Dept. Pico Station approximately two years ago to create the Vandalism Enforcement Team -- and we netted 312 arrests in 2009 alone. Of these, 116 suspects were known gang members and 66 suspects belonged to a tagging crew. Charges filed against those arrested ranged from probation and parole violations to witness intimidation, possession of stolen property, assault with a deadly weapon, and narcotics-related offenses. Though the economy in this area of L.A. County is still very sluggish, serious crime here is down 2 percent compared to last year -- and it's decreased by almost 25 percent over the past five years.


### 3 EASTSIDE COUNTY LIBRARIES GET WHOLE NEW LOOK!

### FIGHTING CRIME IN FLORENCE-FIRESTONE AND WALNUT PARK


We're working with the Sheriff's Dept. and the Second Supervisorial District to keep our Florence-Firestone and Walnut Park neighborhoods safe. On top of extra Sheriff's Deputy patrol and more emphasis on quality-of-life incidents, we recently installed surveillance cameras at eight crime hot spots. Our goal is to prevent crime--particularly gang retaliation shootings--and to catch criminals quickly, especially if they're fleeing a crime scene. Though fighting crime always will remain a top priority, Florence-Firestone and Walnut Park are safer places to live than before. The neighborhood endured two homicides last year versus 13 homicides five years ago. If you have a law enforcement concern or want to help improve public safety, contact the Sheriff's Dept. 



