The Commercial Sexual Exploitation of Children (CSEC) 101 training seeks to establish a well-informed baseline of understanding issues and concerns affecting CSEC. As the CSEC epidemic in Los Angeles County and throughout the United States reaches critical mass, knowledge about mental and physical health issues, identification of at risk youth and victims, and implementation of early prevention and intervention strategies are essential in the delivery of services. The training will include a discussion on "complex" trauma experienced by the exploited youth, effective assessment tools, identification of risk factors, and impact of sexual exploitation on youth development. In summary, this training will provide participants with the knowledge and skills to provide culturally and linguistically competent intervention and treatment to sexually and commercially exploited youth.

TARGET AUDIENCE: Community-based agencies serving Transition Age Youth (TAY)

OBJECTIVES: As a result of attending this training, participants should be able to:

- 1) Recite commonly-held beliefs and stereo-types that promote CSEC
- 2) List terms needed to discuss and understand issues of CSEC
- 3) Describe the prevalence in U.S. of African American girls involved in CSE activities.
- 4) Explain and discuss the various risk factors (environmental and psychosocial) that make children vulnerable to CSEC
- 5) Explain methods of recruitment used by exploiters
- 6) Describe the psychological and physical impact of trauma and exploitation
- 7) Describe the specific subcultures of commercial sexual exploitation including rules, norms, and street terminology
- 8) List potential warning signs of CSEC and intervention strategies
- 9) List the main characteristics of CSEC victims and discuss strategies for addressing such issues in a professional capacity
