Gentlemen:

A statistical report covering the operations of the Coroner's office for the fiscal year 1939-40 is submitted herewith.

The case load of 6282 bodies handled during this period was only 92 greater than during the preceding year, which is the smallest increase in volume of work experienced for many years. This was probably due to the fact that there were no great disasters in which many persons were killed during this period, and the people of this area have enjoyed unusually excellent health.

I am pleased to call your attention to the fact that through the practice of strict economy we were able to reduce our cost per case to \$13.88, which is 62 cents per unit less than our cost for the preceding year and which represents a saving of \$3895.00 to the tappayers of this county. This economy was effected without impairment to the service rendered to the public. We are proud of the fact that we are able to render far greater service at far less cost to the tappayers than any other Coroner's office in the United States.

The statistical information presented herewith is so arranged as to permit easy comparison with former Annual Reports and to note the trends in the various types of fatalities.
