REPORT DIGEST

DEPARTMENT OF CORONER - ANNUAL REPORT 1954-55

The Coroner's Department had a caseload of 8634 cases for the fiscal year 1954-55, which shows an increase of 95 over the previous year. a breakdown of this total is as follows:

Deaths	due to natural causes	5490
Due to	traffic	792
Due to	suicides	741
Due to	homicides	163
Due to	industrial accidents	124
Due to	miscellaneous accidents	1233

Of the 792 traffic fatalities 268 were pedestrian, 125 of which were over 65 years of age. 148 of these pedestrian deaths occured at an intersection.

There were 524 collision and non-collision accidental deaths in motor vehicles, 426 of which were over 20 years of age.

5 persons lost their lives through electric railway accidents and 15 through steam railway accidents.

Of the 163 homicides, 103 were in the age group of 20 to 45 years of age. 60 of the homicide deaths were the result of altercations.

Of the 741 suicides, 205 were the result of despondency and 172 due to ill health.

Of the miscellaneous accidental fatalities, 676 persons were 65 years of age and over, and falls of various types accounted for 606 deaths.

3897 autopsies were performed of the 8634 cases processed by the Coroner during the year. 10717 tests were made in the toxicological laboratory and 3193 microscopic examinations in the pathological laboratory.

305 inquests were held during the year.

The Department's total expenditure during 1954-55 was \$341,869.44, comprised as follows: Salaries and Wages, \$304,012.15; Maintenance and Operation, \$36,269.59 and Capital Outlay \$1587.70.

Revenues collected for the fiscal year 1954-55 were \$74,567.53.
