- Kathleen Crowley requested her comment from April be read at the meeting
  - Hi, my name is Kathleen Crowley and I'm executive director of Procovery Institute. I work closely with both providers and service recipients and have heard firsthand concerns regarding the usage of restraints at LA general. There's an opportunity to not only improve patient care, but worker safety and systemic outcomes, both therapeutically and economically. Instead, rather than shining a light on what is actually occurring, you've opted for a highly curated presentation and a curated site visit and you've left out of the conversation in any meaningful way representation by one entire stakeholder group, and that's the most vulnerable and disempowered of all stakeholder groups and the group the system is funded to serve. And shamefully, instead, you were discussing sending a letter of support or acknowledgement. This doesn't constitute oversight, and instead it's highly irresponsible. Please reconsider. Thank you
