Deputy Perez DENIED my ACCOMODATIONS REQUEST to manually file my police report via EMAIL or PHONE instead forcing me to come to the station. My name is Dr. Jaquel J Pitts, Ph.D. I am a black card member . This hereby serves as a COMPLAINT against the new Indian security guard who has been most recently working at the following planet fitness.

Indian security guard

Between 745pm and 815pm I watched this Indian security guard take pictures in the planet fitness locker room and bathroom areas while various planet fitness members were using the locker room and bathroom

In the last couple of weeks I also notice that this Indian security guard is frequently and excessively in the men's locker room which is odd. Obviously the Indian security guard is never in the women's locker room so why is a security guard frequently in the men's locker room?

I myself have experience in security and I've never heard of security guard being instructed to excessively monitor a men's locker room and take pictures in a men's locker room and bathroom while patrons are present.

This Indian security guard frequently stereotypes. I visit the black lounge frequently and sometimes I'm watching TV and I turn around and the Indian security guard is staring right at me.

Recording or photographing men or anyone else in a locker room is a serious crime that violates privacy laws. All 50 states have "peeping tom" or voyeurism laws that make it illegal to photograph or record individuals without their consent in places where they have a reasonable expectation of privacy, such as locker rooms, restrooms, and changing rooms.

Legal consequences

Invasion of privacy laws vary by state, but the consequences can be severe and may include:

Criminal charges: Taking photos or video of a person who is naked or partially undressed in a private space is a crime. In California, for example, it is considered criminal invasion of privacy under Penal Code 647(j).

Felony charges: If the victim is a minor, the charges are significantly more severe and can result in registration as a sex offender.
