- ii. Update on County Counsel's Litigation Cost Report for Fiscal Year (FY) 2024-25. The fiscal year runs from July 1<sup>st</sup> to June 30<sup>th</sup>.
  - a. The County of Los Angeles spent \$229.3 million in total litigation expenses in FY 2024-25, a 4 percent increase from the prior year's \$220.4 million. The County paid \$111.3 million for attorneys' fees and costs for lawyering. The County also paid \$118 million for settlements, which includes 18 judgments and 290 lawsuits.
  - b. LASD remains the single most costly department by a substantial margin, accounting for \$112 million, or nearly 49 percent, of all County litigation expenses, despite being just one of dozens of County departments.

LASD settlements for "law enforcement" purposes cost L.A. taxpayers \$56,726,883 in FY 2024-25. This figure is 51 percent of the total litigation cost for LASD and about 25 percent of the total litigation cost for L.A. County.

It is worth noting that the "law enforcement" category does NOT include employment litigation; that cost is an additional \$14,102,990 for FY 2024-25.

Overall, the \$112 million in litigation costs for LASD constitute a 12 percent increase from FY 23-24. LASD litigation costs are going up, not down.

Both the largest judgment and largest settlement against and with the County in FY 2024-25 are due to lawsuits against the Sheriff's Department. This concentration of costs in a single agency, LASD, deserves sustained attention by this Commission.
