3600: One woman just moved from 2600 where she reported there are gnats and bugs coming out of the plumbing. 3600: Gnats and bugs coming out of plumbing + cloudy water with particles in it 3600: sinks backed up/ toilets overflowing 1300: One woman was in a cell without water. She showed me how parched her lips were and said she hadn't had water for "a while" (she was very ill and was unable to communicate linearly.) Her toilet was overflowing. When we brought this to the deputies' attention they said she was probably flooding the room so the shift before probably turned off the water – but there was no documentation of this. Upon further inquiry by SBC, a deputy discovered there was a leak in the pipes next to the woman's cell and the water had been turned off by someone, but they just left her in the cell. Deputies told us they were going to move her to a new cell but did not complete the move before we left.

#### 73. Narrative Report

FIP stepdown -1300

MHAs are getting fewer, and they are having a difficult time recruiting. We were also told recruitment has been paused. Caseloads are very high. We spoke to them about participating in SBC on 5/2 and they were very enthusiastic about doing so.

Concerns:

Not getting credit for their work as MHAs. They have been speaking with OIG and they understand some of the credit issues might need to be addressed at a higher level

such as with the Cal Legislature. However, it was noted that LASD can quickly communicate to CDCR if someone has a disciplinary write-up/problem, but there is minimal communication (if any) about the positive programming completed. This includes the MHA program.

No communication with Court/DA re MHA program so there's an understanding of the rehabilitative efforts the women are undertaking to participate in the MHA program and support the MH care for FIP patients.

Deputies are disrespectful and concerns about retaliation for talking with inspectors was communicated. They expressed they do not want to complain too much so they take away the program. As social workers, it appears to the commissioners that the deputies need additional training about how to interact and support peer support specialists such as the MHAs.

Continued difficulties with lice. (This was an issue at the last CRDF visit)

Sgt Cadmon does not actively participate in communicating with the women. He does not communicate with the MHAs and there's no way for them to follow up, but they have questions.

Deputies are watching videos while on the job.

2300:

\*\*When the commissioners arrived to 2300, a woman was finishing in the shower and was calling for the deputies to let her out of the shower and back into her cell. We are not sure how long she had already been calling. Two trustees also alerted the deputies she was ready. For 42 minutes, she called for the deputies to please let her out of the shower. After the commissioners spoke with the deputies and asked them to please let her out and return her to her cell, they were told they were just finding out about this (in front of them), and that they would get to it. This is while 5 deputies were watching YouTube in the bubble. The commissioners stayed until the woman was let out of the shower and returned to her cell.

EBI

Concerns about the safety of the water for drinking. Worms, black flies coming out of the sink.

Told that January was the last time they were in the outside area. Deputies said that short-staffing was the reason for this. Women reported not enough toilet paper, pads, tampons, and underwear in the EBI dorms.

Three women who were designated by medical to only be on bottom bunks due to medical need/ injury were assigned top bunks by deputies and told they were complaining when asked to switch. They have not been switched — this is an accessibility access issue.

EBI module had an entire row upstairs of sinks clogged.

One woman reported she had not been given underwear for the week, and that the laundry returned to the dorm was not clean.

Not enough hygiene supplies available: told that there is a fixed amount and once it is gone, no more is available for the module. A group of women requested a meeting with Senior Alfaro regarding programs and timing/requested a response to the requests they are submitting.
