



76. Narrative Report

EBI program La Cada had 13 participants and 3 deputies Part of the START Program Engaged instructor Jarrett from a community-based drug treatment program and high participation for the class Had a new enrollee that day Court ordered people get priority- they are provided a progress letter at 12 classes and upon completion (24 classes) Max 15 participants allowed in that class Very unclear how someone enrolls in this class. The class seemed very useful and positive - it is disappointing there are not more people with access. We were told that generally someone must submit an inmate request form to participate in the program. Given the significant problems we regularly observe with these forms this is deeply concerning and seems like an unnecessary barrier to EBI programs. No one could tell us how a waiting list is utilized or how it is tracked Follow up request: please provide SBC with a written out, step-by-step process of how someone goes from requesting participation to enrollment in a class. We are often asked about this process from people in the jail, defense attorneys and public defenders, court personnel, and family/community members so it would be very useful to understand the complete process. 913 - (Opioid Use Disorder/OUD) Overdose module Count: 5 Lunches consistently cold, opened at the bubble, and trustees are not allowed to give until the deputies give the go-ahead which the people in 913 said is usually delayed without a shared or specific reason. On average the food will sit for a couple hours and they were concerned about sanitary issues with the food because of this. People here report being hungry and not receiving enough food There was an issuer where the feces from one cell will back up into another cell when flushed and vice versa They had recently fixed the cell flooding They had hot water in showers but not in the day room People in 913 shared that the deputies still separate time out by folks with cells on the top and cells on the bottom limiting their time to the day room and phones, despite there being only 5 incarcerated people in there, which seemed to be fine when they were let into the dayroom minutes prior to our announced arrival in that module area Both phones work They felt they were treated like the discipline module which was next door They did have access to coffee, TV and EBI They did not have books or access to library They complained about only getting one bottle of cleaning supplies a week There were not Inmate Request Forms and Commissioners requested and refilled They had PREA and NARCAN They have to request trustee trash pick up but it happens People are housed here for 30 days and then returned to their housing Please document the process (from CHS referral to LASD housing) how a person accesses this dorm. Given the widespread problem of people with SUD in the jails this program should be much more robust. 912 - HOH/MOH/Pre-Discipline Cell 5 had feces in the toilet, not occupied Shower had significant leak Seems showers do not happen in this dorm because the hold is 72 hours on average Cell 8 (name redacted) was in significa nt distress - went into medical for chronic health issues but the nurse put him on a mental hold/ suicide watch delaying him being able to be transferred to the hospital. This meant he was stripped of any clothing, mattress or sheets. These conditions were severely negatively impacting him. He shared that he had been requesting to speak to the Sergant to better understand why he was in this situation and had not been able to get an answer to that. Deputies said that no mattress is what is cleared for HOH but because of their training and capacity they take mattresses from all HOH and MOH people at NCCF Cell 12 had what looked like bullet holes that the deputies on shift couldn't explain 911 was the other dorm in this area and that was OSJ holds, guarantines, and medical holds

Disciplinary - 915
7 deputies staffed in the module - all were sitting around when reported findings from our inspection
People are not receiving Title 15 allowed property in the discipline module
NCCF is still using a direct admit policy to the disciplinary module but did not appear to have any particular documentation process as to how/when this is used. As a result, some pre-discipline people are in 912 with their property and some are already in the hole without anything (even though they had not had their due
process/DRB yet)
Property is confiscated from people when still on pre-discipline status
Showers every other day. Showers were skipped the day of our visit
Only when they are let out to shower are they able to throw trash out of their cell
They have no cleaning supplies
No toothpaste had been given out in over 5 days And many shared they had never received any
No notice to families that they will not be able to contact them prior to going to discipline - one person in pre-discipline asked us to contact his family because
they were driving from far away for the visit and he wasn't allowed to call them.
They only have access to hygiene on commissary - not what is in their property even though it is allowable via Title 15
Hallway 980-B smelled like feces
Showers in this area are freezing cold despite hot water in their cells
Almost none of the men we spoke to had pencils (at least 10), making it not possible for them to fill out the Inmate Request Forms, despite this being the only
avenue we were told people had to address a need or issue while in this housing area. When we raised this a staff member said he was not going to give them
pencils because they draw graffiti.
Officer Mota was reportedly one of the few officers in that area that is engaging by account of the folks there and we also saw him do proper checks.
One man showed us a maggot in his food
One man showed us a large roach in his cell
This module is 100% reliant on Deputies conducting title 15 security checks for all their needs and follow up. They do not have meaningful access to complaint
forms or any other type of communication for their basic needs. As a result it appears that most of these issues regularly go unaddressed or ignored.
