#### 73. Narrative Report

We noticed in the watch sergeant's office on the markerboard a note that said there are 119 broken security cameras. When staff were asked about this issue, they stated that it is an ongoing problem, primarily due to Wi-Fi issues and inconsistent service. However, a persistent issue is that over 100 cameras are inoperable, with no clear plan in place to repair them.

We tried to arrange to attend a Town Hall. There was one scheduled on the 3000 floor, but we were unable to observe it because staff reported that they were running wayside lines and were unable to conduct a town hall while we were there. It is unclear whether one was still happening the day we were there, but after we left. The Watch Commander reported that Operations CA Ava Lopez distributes a list of completed and uncompleted town halls at the end of each month. The SBC would request a copy of this monthly list of completed/incomplete townhalls. We inspected one module (3301), where a Town Hall was scheduled for May 12, the day before, as indicated in the Town Hall schedule located in the watch sergeant's office. No one in that Housing area had had a town hall or knew what one was.

6050

An in spoke with one gentleman who is having trouble obtaining identification from the DMV for use in his release. SBC followed up on this issue separately.

The first cell in this module indicated that one of their toilets only flushes every five minutes. They indicated that this was because there were mentally ill inmates on the other side, so the toilet was on a timer, which was affecting these people as well.

6000

This module was abhorrent, and the jail does not appear to be following any protocol to ensure people here receive Title 15 required standards. This area was isolated, dirty, and seemed to be a place where people are thrown into a cell and forgotten about. It is unclear if people here receive mail, but no one appeared to have paperwork or stamps to send out mail. LASD reported that they rely on medical staff to determine when someone leaves this area. Nevertheless, a serious problem existed in providing people with humane conditions in this row.

We spoke to xx. He had been in this cell for six days, without a phone, without any indoor or outdoor recreation, and no access to reading materials or a shower. His light was on 24 hours a day, which he was okay with, so he could see the toilet if he had to go to the bathroom in the middle of the night. Mr. x had a contagious bacterial infection in his eye. Still, he did not know when he would be returning to the general population or when he would be able to access anyone via phone or mail. He had nothing in the cell and was just isolated. He missed Mother's Day, which made him sad.

There was another gentleman who was in a suicide gown. He was facedown and unmoving until we knocked loudly and yelled, and his feet began to move slightly. Staff informed us that security checks are conducted in this area every 15 minutes, but they could not provide us with a record of that. We were told that suicidal inmates are placed in this area when there is not enough room at CTC (inpatient hospital in TTCF). We asked if they would be able to go to 171 or somewhere in TTCF instead, where there is constant viewing of the inmates and windows/sunlight and it is more appropriate for HOH inmates. We were told that TTCF can (and does) refuse to accept people. So when there is no space in the CTC, as was the case with this gentleman, they are thrown into a cold cell with no windows, located in a hallway in MCJ, with only a toilet and a partial mattress, lacking bedding.

3301 (High Power Discipline)

The sign on his door said that he was in discipline for 39 days. It is unclear how the jail overrides Title 15's restriction of more than a 30-day disciplinary sentence.

Not all people on this row had appropriate mattresses with plastic covers. One individual had a mattress made of just foam and a blanket covering the top. He was concerned about the sanitation.

Cell 16. The hot water does not work

Cell 13, the phone does not work. Someone came to fix the phones in cells 12,13, and 14 a few days ago. The technician heard a dial tone in cell 13 so they thought it was fine; however, it still does not work, and no one came back.

One of the TVs on the row is out, and a work order is needed.

#### 75. Narrative Continued

Concerns about ADA accessibility on 6050 -- when one person we spoke to was supposed to go to Court, he claims the wheelchair transportation people never came to get him which led to a court miss-out for him even though he wanted to go. We followed up on severe flooding in the 6053 area, where there had been standing water that looked yellow in the jar collected and shown to inspectors.
