The elevators continue to be broken for 2+ years.

We inquired about the Town Halls they've been conducting. We were told that staff conducted town halls on the following dates:

June 27 - 1701

June 28 - 1702

June 29 - 2500.

3 people in 1701 said no townhall occurred on 6/27. One woman said a few deputies showed up at 8am that day and no one was up (many work various shifts) so deputies left. They also said that in the past, if there's an issue that someone raises at a Townhall, the first thing deputies will do is ask for their name and booking number. Even if that is not relevant to the issue. They felt like it was a deterrent from actually getting information about conditions.

## 76. Narrative Continued

1701 Trustee Dorm (Kitchen Workers)

This module is triple-bunked in some areas, despite there being adequate space to spread out, we were told they were assigned specific (triple-bunked) beds.

Water is pooling along the left side of the back wall. The women had to place towels along the floor to soak up the excess water. They thought it had been seeping through this roof from the shower or module in the floor above them. They reported that they had informed staff several times, and the issue had been ongoing for many days, but it had not been resolved. Upon leaving, I asked the staff if they could submit a work order, and they quickly did so. However, shortly after that, staff informed me that the computer program for submitting work orders was down until 14:00, but that she would leave a note for the next incoming shift to submit a work order. As we have noted before, staff cannot look back to see if other work orders have already been submitted, so she was just going to submit one at this time.

Many women reported that the broken elevators continue to be an issue regarding access to hot food. One woman also noted an ongoing problem where, after food is distributed to the various modules, it is left in the hallway for several shifts before being returned to the kitchen. As a result, the food becomes crusty and moldy on the trays, and its odor permeates the entire facility. It likely attracts rodents and bugs as well, which inspectors were told were seen frequently. Inspectors were told there had been a roach found in their food on Thursday (this visit was Wednesday). We were told "the cook said it is extra protein."

The big sink at the wall in the middle of the module had a large pool of brown standing water. There was a large cardboard sign in it that indicated it was out of order, but the standing water was still there, and in it was a layer of congealed brown sludgey matter. We were told it has been out of order for 3 weeks.

The women who are inmate workers in this module, but who end up getting state prison time, do not get any time credit for working as inmate workers and are just working for free.

People here never go fully outside. The outdoor recreation area, which appears to be what LASD is using to attempt Title 15 compliance, is a fully enclosed space located next to the dorm that is also used for storage. However, it has a waffle window at the top that is exposed to the outside, allowing air to enter several feet above (maybe about 15 ft) - no sunlight.

The module's soda machine is broken; the only TV can only plays DVDs.

The inspectors observed the bathrooms -- one sink in the 1700 bathroom was running nonstop. The ceiling had visible mold, and there was visible rust around the doors and walls.

1702: Women raised concerns about irregularity of mail -- after one month, a letter she had sent was still sitting in the box and had not been taken to be sent out and mailed.

## 77. Narrative Continued

We went to the 1500 outdoor workspace next to the medical. It appears that it is only being used for the FIP step-down, which is going outside. It is unclear why other people throughout the jail do not get access to actual outdoor space. Why don't other people get to go outside? The only people on the outdoor rec log was 1200 and 1300, for 1 to 1.5 hours max, with approx 3-9 people per shift, only AM shifts, no weekends -- the last was last Wednesday (this visit was a Sunday).

## 78. Narrative Continued

2600: General Population

One deputy was working; he reported that there is a population of about 90 people. He reported they had just gone back to their rooms because they had been "programming" from 915 to noon in the main area.

Below are some of the issues that were reported:

12 phones for 90 people, and many are often broken (one had a loose wire that was noted during our inspection). This is an ongoing problem because they only get a fixed amount of time for everyone to use during the programming time.

There's black mold in the shower. There is a bright green mold on the ceiling of the shower. There's black mold clearly visible above the ceiling in between cells 45 and 46.

The toilet in cell 20 constantly ran. It smelled like chlorine and the people in here said this issue had been ongoing for several days, at least 5. (They had requested an emergency work order). The Deputy did not seem to be familiar with the issue; inspectors requested this was handled quickly -- the chlorine smell could be smelled outside of the cell, with a mask on. Both inspectors smelled it. Their sink also did not drain and had to be plunged. The Deputy offered a move to a different room, saying, "Well there's nobody in 15 right now, but that toilet does not work." This issue was reported by the Commissioners to the Watch Commander.

Two security checks were observed, and neither time did staff look into the cells; they simply scanned the barcode quickly and continued.

People complained that staff will stand at the top of the modules and look across the pod, the shower on the bottom tier, and watch people shower for multiple minutes at a time. SBC commissioners noted that the shower was in clear view if a staff person stood at the top of the module as described.

Spoke to several women and their cells, and they showed the bugs that come out of the sink. They have to use tampons to plug the hole and stop the bugs from coming out. They showed one of such tampons to the commissioners, and you could see the little black bugs that come through the water. They also reported that worms are in the water.

Several women complained about the expense of all the items their families are forced to pay for so that they can afford hygiene products (we heard between \$600-800/month). They also reported that the jail-issued food is often cold, so they supplement that with extra food that they buy. They also must purchase necessities from the canteen list. For example, a lady's Speed Stick small deodorant is \$6. The Amer Fresh toothpaste that they get in the fish kit does not work, so they must buy toothpaste for \$3. One woman noted that the jail knows the water is a problem because they give pregnant people access to bottled water, but everyone else must drink regular water. They are capped at 100 ounces a week for purchasing filtered water, which is insufficient for a person.

Significant mail delays. One woman described that her family had sent in a Colleen Hoover book, but it had been returned. When staff determine which books are allowed in they do a cursory Google search, and that is the extent. Is there a policy to decide who gets what? One person said they have not been getting mail for multiple weeks -- one's boyfriend used priority USPS with tracking and saw it had been delivered, but she received no mail and no letter stating the mail was not allowed. Multiple complaints of not getting mail that was sent back in March, April, or May and tracked.

Issues with breakfast coming late and lunch coming late (weekly, lunch arriving around dinner time). Issue with nurses not using correct pronouns for those who are trans.

People here were on lockdown for 4-5 days when LASD was responding to ICE raids (unclear in what way).
