TOPLINE CONCERNS

Additional details on how and why the door from 912 to 913 is "bouncing" open creating unsafe situations for everyone involved, and on the day of the inspection resulting in an attack of one incarcerated individual by another.

There was collective and immense confusion from the currently incarcerated individuals in but 926 and 927 regarding why they were classified as "high power," in the "high power" area, and as such, receiving privilege reduction including but not limited to being handcuffed in hallways, caged for visits and more, and being segregated from others. Lt speer and Adams were under the impression this was supposed to be general population as assigned by Michael Markman through the new Operation Safe Jail program, however the deputy stationed at that pod reported it to be high power, the food had "HP" labeling, and the men reported limited privileged that correspond to a different classification.

Both Module 925 and 910 had a significant plumbing issue that caused safety and health concerns - when the cell next to you flushes, the content of the toilet goes into the next nearest toilet. This is especially concerning because one individual in 927 had Hep C.

GENERAL COMMENTS

NCCF outer building landscaping was being watered at the time of our arrival. It was apparent that the lawn sprinkler system had been running for an extended period since there was extensive water runoff on walkway to front door and driveway. Water conservation should be observed.

Inspection team decided to inspect module 925. Main access hallway to unit was littered with trash such as eggshells, food wrappers and juice cartons. The litter was minimal, however, out of place given the walkway was primarily used by facility staff.

Grievance and Correctional Health Request forms were available.

Various informational forms were posted including PREA notifications.

We saw 2 EBI courses taking place and all were very fully, one had 10+ in session and the had 20+ in attendance (i.e Health Sciences)

Deputy J. Stevens, employee #673795 had good rapport with the men in his module and was very cooperative with SBC commissioners

DETAILED OBSERVATIONS – UNIT 928

This unit was, for the most part, empty except for two cells where three individuals were being held.

Checked unoccupied cells and found #7 and #11 with no hot water.

#8 had extensive graffiti which was apparent in many cells in the unit.

Floors were swept and clutter free.

Phones appeared to be in working condition.

Two individuals in cell 12 were complaining of injuries. Individual #7033147 complained of a broken finger where it was caught smashed as a result of the closure of a "slider door" from one housing unit to another. This occurred a week ago. He stated that he was seen by medical staff and they stated the finger was broken, however, no follow-up has occurred.

Individual #6906387 in cell #9 stated he had broken nose which he received in an attack by another incarcerated individual and was waiting for x-rays.

These three individuals were being housed in this empty unit because another individual attacked them from another housing unit. These three individuals were "dropouts" (left gang life) and were originally housed in a

Nickolas Mallory #6698604 was a couple "notes" on his record but only one classified "major" severity was from 9/24/2024 of which he did 90 days in disciplinary for. Because of this he was confused why he is still in "high power" dorms nearly a year later.

DETAILED NOTES 927

Were ALSO under the understanding that they were in a "high power" module but were unclear why they had received that classification as they had never received any written notification or write ups.

Talked to 5+ men they all had the same experience of getting transferred from MCJ on July 2 or 3rd, 2025, being visited by OIG inspector (Ms. Wright and TBD Arpine sp.) on Jul 7, 2025 (as indicated on an OIG card with handwritten notes I saw myself and will corroborate next month when the notes are published), and then multiple write ups show up for these men entered on July 8, 2025 which I saw for myself on the module computer. See please for specific examples: Jonathan Guerrero #6569039 had a write for having 2 knives and a tattoo machine which he claims to never have and to have never received a physical write up for Jessie Adon #70003510, note of narcotics entered on Jul 98 despite brewing places in 927 on 7/2/2025

Jeffrey Carrasco #4738051

Daniel Garcia #6794246 - came to 927 7/3/2025 and also received a note on his record for "assault with a spear" on 7/8/2025

The incarcerated people uplifting this were concerned they were seeing retaliation after talking to the OIG inspector

The deputy shared that "high power" classifications usually happen because deputies observe others listening to them and not necessarily because they had been notified of this perceived activity.

Carlos Andrade #6476361 - has rashes all over his body. He was supposed to have an appointment at MCJ but they rescheduled it and he was moved and he has not been seen in 3 months
