**Approve the Revised AB 109 Community Corrections Partnership
Implementation Plan**

In 2011, California passed Assembly Bill 109 (AB 109), 2011 Public Safety Realignment that shifted responsibility for certain low-level offenders from the state to the counties. In response to this legislation, the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors (Board) established the Public Safety Realignment Team (PSRT) to coordinate efforts and advise the Board on AB 109 implementation matters. On December 8, 2020, the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors (Board) passed a motion to expand the membership of the PSRT and directed the PSRT to update the County’s existing AB 109 Community Corrections Partnership Implementation Plan and provide funding recommendations to the Chief Executive Office that reflects the Board’s priorities.

The PSRT has been committed to ensuring that the updated Plan aligns with the County's "Care First, Jail Last" model. The updated AB 109 Community Corrections Partnership Implementation Plan (Plan) submitted by the PSRT offers principles and strategies to help guide implementation of realignment in the County in a way that both addresses obligations shifted to the County through realignment and advance the Board's

justice priorities. The Plan offers a framework for expanding treatment and service delivery approaches in order to support reentry and improve outcomes, as well as help to reduce the number of individuals ultimately subject to AB 109 supervision or custody. The Plan is a reflection of the thoughtfulness of the PSRT in their effort to ensure that the County is addressing the needs of the justice-impacted population and is the first step in revisiting AB 109 funding allocations. The annual AB 109 funding allocations should reflect the newly updated AB 109 Community Corrections Partnership Implementation Plan, which is itself a reflection of the Board's priorities. The PSRT was also asked to submit recommendations to CEO for AB 109 funding allocations based on this updated Plan. The process of updating the plan and providing funding recommendations will be repeated annually.

The approval of the updated AB 109 Community Corrections Partnership Implementation Plan is not only critical to the Board's commitment to the transformation of the criminal justice system but to improving the lives of the justice-impacted population.

WE, THEREFORE MOVE that the Board of Supervisors approve the updated AB 109 Community Corrections Partnership Implementation Plan submitted on June 15, 2021 by the PSRT, as permitted by law, and that the approved Plan be considered the County's updated Community Corrections Partnership Plan.
