

Re-establish the Reward Offer in the Murder of Cedric Hurd

On December 18, 2001, at 9:15 p.m. 26-year-old Cedric Hurd was walking near the 10900 block of South Hobart Blvd in the unincorporated area of Westmont to see his 3-year-old daughter. A car approached Mr. Hurd and a man stepped out. Mr. Hurd was then shot and killed in front of his 3-year-old daughter on the front lawn of her house.

Just prior to his tragic death, Mr. Hurd shared news with his family about his new job. As a father and active member of his church, Mr. Hurd was loved by his family and community members.

This case remains unsolved 20 years after the murder occurred. This reward was established on July 27, 2021, expired on October 24, 2021, and needs to be re-established. Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department detectives investigating this case recommend that this reward be re-established to help solve the crime and encourage members of the community to come forward with information that would assist detectives in identifying the suspect(s) responsible for this heinous crime, as well as help bring much needed closure for Mr. Hurd's loved ones.

I THEREFORE MOVE THAT THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS:

Re-establish the offer of a reward in the amount of \$20,000 in exchange for information leading to the apprehension and conviction of the person(s) responsible for the heinous death of 26-year-old Cedric Hurd, who was shot and killed on December 18,
