Reestablish Extension of the Reward Offer in the Hit and Run of Pomona Resident

On November 23, 2016, a 36-year-old resident of Pomona, California, ran out of gas while traveling on the westbound Interstate 10 Freeway, west of Kellogg Drive. The individual retrieved an empty gas canister and positioned himself over the streel guardrail with wooden posts, with the intention of crossing the eastbound lanes of the Interstate 10 Freeway. The individual began to walk in a southerly direction across the eastbound lanes when an unidentified vehicle struck him. The individual, unfortunately, succumbed to the injuries sustained from the hit, while the driver of the unidentified vehicle fled the scene.

To date, the California Highway Patrol (CHP) Investigators assigned to the case have not received any viable clues or information regarding this incident nor about the driver.

On May 8, 2018, the Los Angeles County (County) Board of Supervisors (Board) established a reward offer of \$10,000 to assist in the investigation and re-established it
