Faith leaders often have access to networks of members who can provide concrete and non-tangible supports for families such as food, diapers, formula, clothing, mentoring, advocacy, expenses to cover utilities and rent, and even spaces for family bonding activities pivotal to safely reunifying families.

FBOs are often the entity working closest with vulnerable families and communities; thus, well positioned to refer youth, caregivers, or families to an array of community support services that can help to stabilize the family system before more invasive interventions are necessary. The proclamation also acknowledges and celebrates FBOs for their collaborative work with other community-based organizations, philanthropy, and external stakeholders. Together we bring impact. Together we provide solutions, and Faith Leaders have answered the call.

As the County continues its mission to build stronger relationships with local faith leaders and FBOs, proclaiming October as Faith Leader Appreciation Month would provide County departments the opportunity to celebrate, honor, and affirm faith leaders for their commitment and dedication to the children, families, and communities they tirelessly serve. It is our hope that during Faith Leader Appreciation Month, faith leaders and FBOs are appreciated countywide for their outstanding service and acknowledged for their role as vital County partners.
