		Oppose	Monisha Parker	Reducing the budget realignment for extending the summer swim season at Los Angeles County pools requires careful consideration of various factors. Here are some approaches you might explore:	
				Reduce the scope of the extension:	
				* **Shorter extension:** Instead of extending the entire season, consider a shorter extension period. This could significantly reduce costs associated with pool operation, staffing, and maintenance. * **Limited days/hours:** Open pools for an extended period only on weekends or specific days instead of daily throughout the week.
