		Oppose	Dakota Kelley	<p>The Los Angeles County Department of Public Works is responsible for the construction and operation of Los Angeles County's roads, building safety, sewerage, and flood control.</p> <p>Los Angeles County's roads are in horrible condition; therefore, let the Public Works department focus its energy on improving its performance in meeting DPW's original mission.</p> <p>The Sheriff's PED operates at an annual total cost of \$9.037 million. There are 12 supervising parking control officers budgeted among the 90 positions. Per BOS Holly Mitchell's motion, poor performance is the cause for the departmental transfer. Poor performance is easily addressed within the Sherriff's Department by creating a policy every two years the supervising parking control officer's position is available for any staff member to apply (including the existing officer reapplying).</p> <p>I oppose the departmental transfer because Public Work's performance regarding street repair in not exemplary.</p>
			Daria H Brooks	<p>Unincorporated areas have had to rely on our Parking Enforcement officers to manage issues for which they were never intended, mainly monitoring the invasion of dilapidated recreational vehicles and excessive street parking. These issues are completely the fault of the Board of Supervisors, who should have extended Title 15 non-conforming vehicle restricted parking codes to ALL unincorporated areas a decade ago, rather than just the few privileged areas currently protected. Our unarmed parking officers are being scapegoated by Supervisor Mitchell for citizen's complaints that rest at her doorstep. We strongly oppose this motion and ask that parking enforcement remain with the Sheriff's Department.</p>
