Public Comment		Other	Anne Ingalls	<p>The following individuals submitted comments on agenda item:</p> <p>One fiasco after another: Last week, the Attorney General of California charged George Gascon's hand-picked Assistant District Attorney for Ethics and Integrity, the number 3 position in the office, Diana Teran, with 11 felony violations of Penal Code section 502(c)(2), better known as "accessing and using computer data without permission." The cascade of lawsuits that promises to follow are reminiscent of the Jailhouse Informant Scandal of 1989 and will cost millions of dollars.</p> <p>Before she was charged with 11 felonies, Teran supervised 20 or more special units, including Conviction Review, Resentencing, Public Integrity Division, Justice System Integrity Division, Appellate, and Organized Crime. These units handle some of the most politically sensitive cases. The District Attorney's Office's ethical Brady obligations require them to notify every defendant or inmate in every case and/or parole hearing over which Diana Teran had authority or ordered any action. All those cases will need to be reviewed and potentially re-litigated. Law enforcement officers whose data she accessed will likely sue. The ripple effects of Gascon's colossal lack of judgement and multiple failures as a manager have, and will continue to, cost the taxpayers of Los Angeles County millions of dollars.</p> <p>At last count 20 LADA employees have filed lawsuits alleging retaliation and malfeasance. Gascon, and by extension, the county have already paid out millions of dollars with tens of millions more on the horizon.</p> <p>The Board of Supervisors has approved many of Gascon's special requests. One of these requests was to allow Diana Teran to work "on loan" to the District Attorney's Office from the Public Defender's Office for most of 2021. Although it seems incongruous, she represented the People in cases in which the defendant was represented by the Public Defender's Office.</p> <p>Los Angeles County policies, Ordinances, and Civil Service rules were enacted to avoid these disastrous results. The Board should direct District Attorney Gascon to follow them. The residents and taxpayers of Los Angeles County can't afford Gascon any longer.</p>

To Whom It May Concern,

I'm writing to express the desperate need for a "No Turn on Red" sign on Killian Ave, westbound, when turning right onto S Nogales St, and for a left turn arrow street light when facing South on S Nogales St at the intersection with Killian Ave in Rowland Heights.

To elaborate on my concern, there are four schools all within one block of this intersection: Angela Preschool & Kindergarten, Rowland Unified Community Day School, Killian Elementary School, and Rowland High School. Parents and students from all four schools pass through this intersection at some point during their commute. Considering Angela Preschool alone, we have about 130 parents who all make U-Turns at this intersection between 7:30 AM to 11 AM and 4 PM to 6:30 PM. This number does not even include the thousands of parents and students from Rowland High School and Killian Elementary School who also use this intersection.

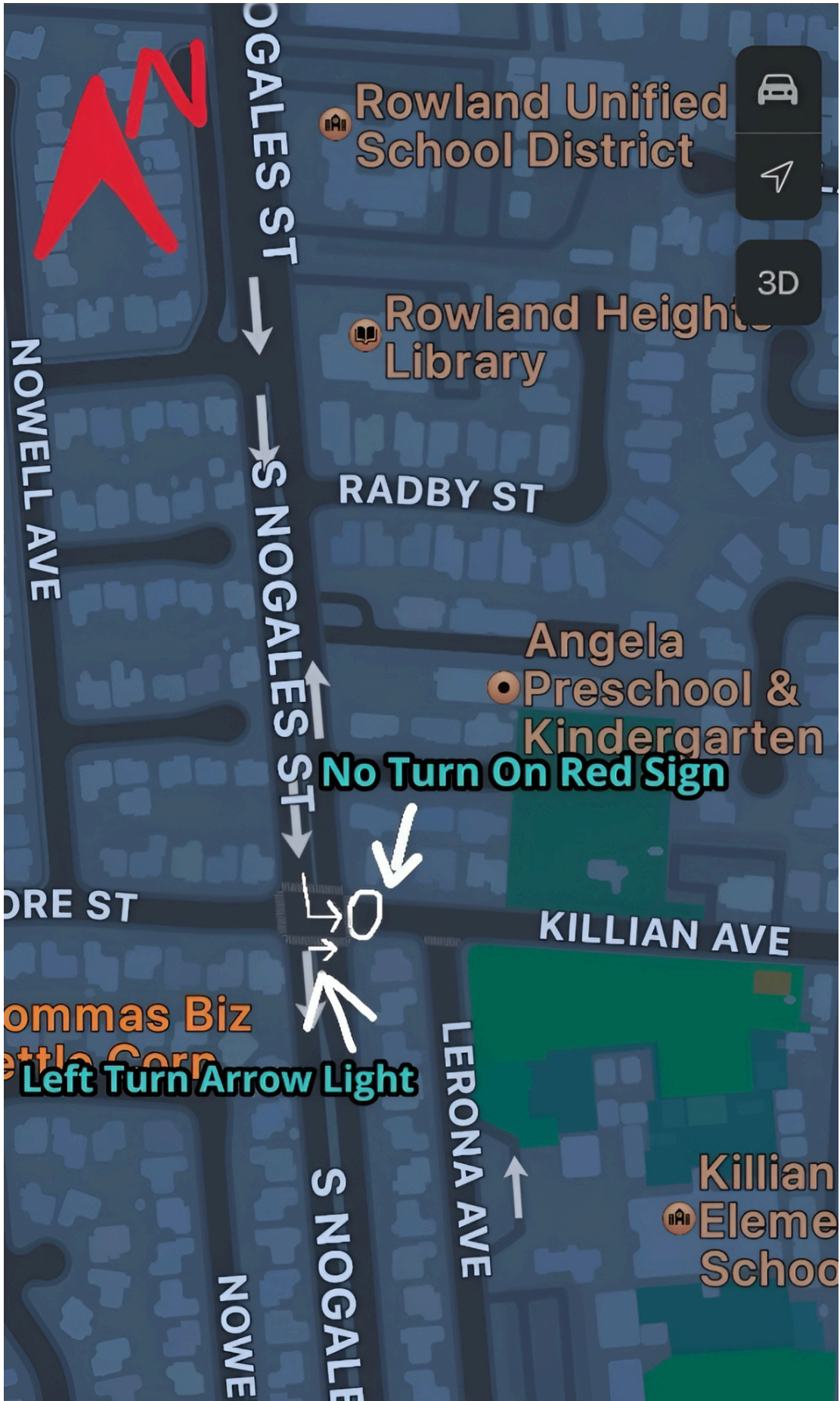
Furthermore, on S Nogales S, Northbound, is a downward slope where cars tend to exceed 50 mph. In fact, only a few months ago, while a child was crossing the intersection, a driver couldn't slow down from their downhill speed, resulting in a serious accident. This incident caused the intersection and its surrounding areas to be blocked off to allow time for the police to clean up the scene and for the ambulance to rush to pick up the unconscious, bleeding child. Consequently, even if a driver were to clearly see that oncoming cars are far away while making a U-Turn on the street, the high speed of passing cars makes it very difficult to execute a safe maneuver. Additionally, drivers making right turns from Killian onto S Nogales will struggle to focus on both oncoming cars and the cars making U-Turns.

I urge the council to prioritize the safety of drivers, especially the children, and to implement a "No Turn on Red" sign on Killian Ave, westbound, when turning right onto S Nogales St, as well as a left turn arrow street light on S Nogales St and Killian Ave Southbound (in the direction of Colima Rd to Pathfinder Rd). Every year, multiple accidents occur at this intersection, and we hope that the implementation of these two road signs/lights will help reduce their frequency.
