Reward Extension in the Homicide Investigation of Murder Victim Michael Moreno

On Sunday, December 23, 2018, at approximately 6:30 p.m., Los Angeles County Sheriff’s Department (LASD) deputies were dispatched to the 200 block of South Acacia Street in the city of San Dimas. Responding deputies found 35-year-old Michael Moreno suffering from gunshot wounds. One other victim was also struck by gunfire but survived. Victim Moreno succumbed to his injuries and was pronounced dead at the scene.

Victim Moreno was talking with two of his friends outside when the suspect(s) approached them and opened fire. LASD homicide detectives are still investigating whether the incident was gang-related, but do not believe Victim Moreno was the intended target. Victim Moreno was not a gang member and had no gang affiliations. The family members, who are completely distressed by this tragedy, remain in contact with detectives and have been assisting in any way possible throughout the investigation.

The \$10,000 reward was approved by this Board on March 1, 2022, extended on May 17, 2022, extended on November 15, 2022, extended on May 16, 2023, extended on November 7, 2023, and is set to expire on May 18, 2024. LASD detectives have been diligently investigating the case and believe the extension of this reward will encourage witnesses to come forward and provide information to this investigation. Any individuals with information about this crime are urged to contact the LASD Homicide Bureau or Crime Stoppers.

I, THEREFORE, MOVE that the Board of Supervisors extend the reward previously offered in the amount of \$10,000 in exchange for information leading to the apprehension and conviction of the perpetrator(s) responsible for the murder of 35-year-old Michael Moreno.
