ACCEPT A GRANT AWARD FROM THE CALIFORNIA GOVERNOR'S OFFICE OF EMERGENCY SERVICES FOR FISCAL YEAR 2023 CALIFORNIA COVERDELL PROGRAM (ALL DISTRICTS) (3 VOTES)

#### **SUBJECT**

Request the Board to execute the attached Certification of Assurance of Compliance and authorize the Sheriff of the Los Angeles County (County), or his designee, to accept and execute a grant award from the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services (Cal OES) for the 2023 California Coverdell Program (Program) in the amount of \$163,997. The Program is financed with federal funds offered by the United States Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, National Institute of Justice, Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance Number 16.742, passing through the State of California. The funding shall be utilized to secure continuing education and training programs and laboratory equipment and supplies benefitting the forensic technical staff assigned to Scientific Services Bureau (SSB) within the County Sheriff's Department (Department).

#### IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT THE BOARD:

1. Request the Chair of the Board to sign and affix a wet signature to the attached Certification of Assurance of Compliance form required by Cal OES as part of the grant application process.

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- 2. Delegate authority to the Sheriff, or his designee, as an agent for the County, to sign and accept the grant award, subsequent to execution by Cal OES for the Program in the amount of \$163,997 for the grant period of April 1, 2024, through March 31, 2025. There is no match requirement for the Program.
- 3. Delegate authority to the Sheriff, or his designee, as an agent for the County, to execute and submit all required grant documents, including, but not limited to, agreements, modifications, extensions, and payment requests that may be necessary for the completion of the Program.
- 4. Delegate authority to the Sheriff, or his designee, as an agent for the County, to apply and submit a grant application to Cal OES for the Program in future fiscal years (FYs), and to execute all required grant application documents, including assurances and certifications, when and if such future funding becomes available.

#### PURPOSE/JUSTIFICATION OF RECOMMENDED ACTIONS

The SSB has been identified by Cal OES to receive funding under the Program. In complying with the objective of the grant, the allocation will pay the tuition for forensic technical staff to attend educational and training seminars, and to purchase equipment and supplies to improve the quality, timeliness, and credibility of Departmental investigations and evidence examinations.

As a laboratory accredited by the American National Standards Institute National Accreditation Board (ANAB), SSB strives to maintain conformance with all accreditation requirements. The purpose of training is to maintain the consistent delivery of valid and accurate results, increase productivity, and enable staff to assume greater responsibilities within their respective assignments. In an effort to maintain the standard of continuing education for all forensic technical staff, it is necessary to provide a wide variety of specialized training opportunities.

#### Implementation of Strategic Plan Goals

By augmenting SSB's production capacity with new equipment, and by providing analysts and examiners with the training, knowledge, and skills necessary to improve their accuracy and efficiency, all of which combine to reduce backlogged cases, this Program is consistent with the County's Strategic Plan North Star III: Realize Tomorrow's Government Today; Focus Area Goal F: Flexible and Efficient Infrastructure: Use lessons learned from the recent pandemic to implement flexible and efficient administrative, technological, and physical infrastructures to meet the needs of

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our constituents; Strategy III. Technological Advancement/Digital Divide: Invest in equitable access to the internet, technology, and digital resources.

#### FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING

Grant funds in the amount of \$163,997 will be used to purchase services and supplies and pay for travel expenses and tuition fees for SSB forensic technical staff. Funding for this grant proposal will be included in the Department's FY 2024-25 Supplemental Budget request.

#### FACTS AND PROVISIONS/LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

Before the finalization of the grant award agreement, Cal OES requires applicants to complete a Certificate of Assurance of Compliance form, signed by the applicant's governing body, which includes details regarding the requirements of Federal Grant Funds, Equal Employment Opportunity, Drug-Free Workplace Act of 1990, California Environmental Quality Act, Lobbying, Debarment and Suspension and Proof of Authority from the City Council/Governing Board.

On January 5, 2024, the Department submitted an application in response to the Cal OES grant solicitation. Prior to submitting the application, Cal OES advised that the Department was pre-selected to receive \$163,997 with no match requirement.

This will be the 20th year the Department has received Program funding. The grant period is from April 1, 2024, through March 31, 2025.

All forensic services and supplies purchased with the Program funding will be procured in accordance with the County's purchasing policies and procedures.

The Board letter has been reviewed and the attached Certification of Assurance of Compliance has been approved as to form by County Counsel.

## **IMPACT ON CURRENT SERVICES (OR PROJECTS)**

This Program will have a positive impact on SSB's performance and will enhance the Department's ability to successfully accomplish its mission, goals, and objectives.
