Furthermore, the last time the code was amended within the district was prior to the sale of surplus properties unilaterally opposed by residents in the district which awarded the properties to developer Lennar Homes under dubious circumstances.</p> <p>There is concern that school board member Gino Kwok has multiple property interests within the district including a special agreement with former school board member Norman Hsu and his business entity known as Bela Education Group Inc.</p> <p>Gino Kwok has ties to Charlie Klinakis, former mayor of the city of La Puente who appears to have brokered a real estate deal within the city's jurisdiction which also overlap with the school district jurisdiction for the entitlement approval of a condominium development project that involves a business associate of Gino Kwok. This should have been disclosed and was not—why would the board of supervisors further allow a weakening of the conflict-of-interest code in a school district riddled with corruption and conflict of interest? This proposal, if approved, allows the omission of disclosures that should be required by allowing exemptions to be carved out on the disclosure reporting requirements if the superintendent or his designee feel that the disclosure requirement is not necessary.</p> <p>Rather than create a more stringent requirement for conflict-of-interest reporting requirements, the Board of Supervisors may be complicit and open itself to exposure in allowing a much weaker conflict of interest policy to move forward.</p> <p>Last November, the Board of Supervisors were made aware of the concerns raised by parents within the school district at the closure of schools within the District. At the time of writing this comment to the Board, HLPUSD is currently seeking to hire a senior facilities manager, who according to these proposed changes would now be subject to a less stringent conflict of interest disclosure.
