7.		Favor	Connie Chung Joe	AJSOCAL expresses its support of Item #7, the County Charter Amendment. Although we continue to feel some reservations about the process, which felt rushed and did not allow for sufficient community engagement, we ultimately feel that the benefits of the charter reform proposal outweigh those concerns. Specifically, we are in full support of expanding the number of board seats. Although we wish there was more contemporary data to support 9 being the optimal number of seats, we acknowledge that in general, increasing the number of seats is a positive outcome. Simply put, more seats at the table mean for more representation by leaders from underrepresented or entirely unrepresented communities. Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders (AAPIs), who make up 16% of the County population, do not have a representative on the Board and under the current configuration of 5 board seats, will most likely continue to be unrepresented for many years to come. 9 seats would expand the table to finally give AAPIs a chance to create a district where we could elect someone from our own community, as well as potentially adding more seats for the Latinx community, which is also underrepresented on the Board. 9 seats gives opportunity to have more leaders of color on the Board to better reflect the diversity of the County. We express our support for this Charter Amendment with caution, as there are still many unknowns in this process, including the full scope of the role of the county elected executive, the extent of the power that could be stripped away from the Supervisors, and the financial costs. We appreciate that the plan has built in a review process every 10 years to allow for course corrections and to address unintended consequences. Should this motion move forward and the matter go to the voters on the November ballot, we call upon the Board to employ a far more inclusive, engaged, and open process moving forward that would allow for more opportunities for community input and reform.

Subject: Letter of Opposition for Charter Amendment - LA County Governance Reform

Dear Honorable Members of the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors,

We write to express our deep concern and unfortunate opposition to the current motion for a charter amendment for LA County Governance Reform being proposed for the November 2024 ballot. We respectfully request your NAY vote when the matter returns for your final approval on the ground that the proposed charter amendment for LA County governance reform as written today and the process that was taken to bring it about are fundamentally flawed in several areas, not backed by empirical evidence and lack true community engagement and inclusivity.

In recent years, LA County has made progress in several ways by having decision-makers collaborate closely with community leaders, organizations, and advocates, all of whom believe that solutions lie within the community and emphasize racial equity, inclusivity, and solidarity. The creation of the Office of Anti-Racism, Diversity, and Inclusion (ARDI) under the direction of the LA County CEO, the Equity in County Contracting initiative, the establishment of the Department of Youth Development, and the Justice, Care, and Opportunities Department all demonstrate the achievements possible when the community is given the opportunity to provide in-depth analysis and feedback through values-centered community engagement processes before the findings from those processes are codified into actions. Additionally, the implementation of Measure J -- now known as the Care First Community Investment that is allocating nearly \$300 million annually towards community investments and alternatives to incarceration -- has an advisory committee composed of leaders from both LA County departments and the community that collaboratively decide the best ways to steward the resources for positive impact. These initiatives illustrate that governance rooted in the values of multi-racial democracy, solidarity, and inclusivity can effectively address systemic inequities and enhance community well-being. Engaging the community and ensuring their voices are heard is crucial to the success of such reforms, leading to more effective and sustainable outcomes.

The LA County Governance Reform package appears to be driven by polling data rather than the values and needs of our communities, unlike previous efforts. When asked about the decision to expand to nine seats, the response that it "polled well" and references to the board of supervisors' commentary from the 1970s highlight the disconnect between this proposal and the actual needs and desires of current Los Angeles County residents. The rushed and secretive manner in which this proposal was created and advanced, coupled with the lack of openness to amendments at the last Board of Supervisors

meeting, does not reflect the good governance practices we expect from our leaders. If this charter amendment makes it to the ballot, the public is being strong-armed into voting on a package that does not truly represent them, their wants or their needs.

The expansion of the number of supervisor districts, increased transparency, and a less political budgeting process are certainly appealing. However, if these rhetorical advances are built on empty promises and whimsical estimates not backed by empirical evidence or based on a promise that our communities will be rewarded later in exchange for our support today, the potential damages to our communities is too great a risk to bear. The current motion for a charter amendment does not align with the values of multi-racial democracy, solidarity, and inclusive governance. If it did, it would have involved meaningful participation from the people most affected by these decisions from the beginning. Therefore, we are forced to say no and oppose these efforts and request something new, something better, something we can say we co-created.

True representation requires actively including our voices and perspectives in the decision-making process. Polling a select few does not equate to an inclusive, equity-driven, community-centered approach to governance reform. More work is needed to ensure that any reform package truly reflects the aspirations and needs of LA County's diverse communities.

We offer our support to a plan a process that allows exploration, answers questions upfront, measures the impact of expansion equitably across all communities, and works directly to repair ongoing harms to Black, Native, Indigenous, Pacific Islander, Asian, Latine, LGBTQIA+, Differently Abled, and other members of the global majority in LA County. This approach ensures we do not repeat the mistakes of the past and that all Angelenos in every walk of life can benefit from a just and equitable governance system. We demand a complete halt of the efforts for this charter amendment. We fully agree that LA County needs governance reform, but this proposed charter amendment and the process that was taken to bring it about are fundamentally flawed and lack true community inclusivity. We can, and must, do better—together.

Thank you for your attention to this critical matter.
