8.		Oppose	paul burt	<p>Have the County and Public School Districts therein, been so poorly managed, that school buses are no longer available for transport to and from such events? Particularly in this example, where a very few miles are involved. Such fee waivers are fundamentally unfair and represent another in a long line of slaps to the faces of the taxpayers!</p> <p>Anyone in their right mind knows that parking fees are nothing more than revenue generators for a County fiscally deteriorating with each election. As for the Harbors and Beaches parking fee schedule, it wasn't very long ago before this Board - led yet again where fee increases are concerned by Ms Hahn - that the Public Parking rates at all County beach parking lots were increased by \$1.00. Does a "surplus" as a result of that increase, now exist affording such a blithe fee waiver for the PV School surfing event?</p> <p>In the Winter of 2023, I purchased an Annual Senior Beach Parking Pass from the County Department of Beaches & Harbors for a reasonable \$25. Three months later my vehicle which had the parking pass sticker "assigned" to it, was demolished by a hit and run driver. Subsequently, my "total loss" car crushed and scrapped by the impound yard.</p> <p>I appealed to Beaches and Harbors for a replacement. I was told that an additional \$25 charge was required of me, as replacement for a "lost sticker". I explained - with documentation from the LAPD 7th Street impound yard, confirming that the car had been scrapped and that my sticker wasn't "lost". No matter! Beaches and Harbors demanded an additional \$25 payment for a replacement sticker. "Cheap" doesn't convey the half of it...</p> <p>As for this surfing event specifically, apparently, as result of decades worth of egregious, never ceasing tax increases heaped on by State, County, and Municipal entities the Palos Verdes Unified School District - which remains one of the wealthiest in all of the Los Angeles area - can no longer afford school bus service to and from such events, bus service for the short ride that would 1) be safer for parents and athletes and 2) lessen congestion on the streets.</p> <p>And lastly, I ask this Board: Is the Palos Verdes Unified School District somehow exempt from your ideological mantra of "the rich must pay their fair share"?</p> <p>With the occasional exception of Ms. Barger, this Board remains a fiscal nightmare for taxpayers!</p>
