The amount of money that hundreds of organizations are competing for in the OGP category isn't very much. While I applaud that the BOS increased the budget for the OGP grants for the first time in 15 years last year (from about \$4,400,000 to \$5,670,000) that increase doesn't even match the rate of inflation and so it actually represents less purchasing power than the amount of funding in 2009. Increasing the amount of funding, will allow greater amounts of money to be distributed to each grantee, which would also make the incentive to apply greater.
