I am writing to propose a comprehensive plan for establishing emergency climate shelters in Los Angeles County in response to the increasing frequency of extreme weather events and climate crises we face. Shelter Design and Amenities Our shelters must prioritize comfort and safety, equipped with adequate

		10. Sustainability and Long-Term Planning Finally, as we move forward, advocating for permanent supportive housing solutions alongside these emergency shelters will be essential. Collaborating with local government on long-term climate resilience strategies will further enhance our emergency response framework.
