The Department of Health Services (DHS) also notes that this measure would secure dedicated funding, enhanced financial accountability, and stability in the provision of essential health services for the County's vulnerable populations.  The MCO tax and resulting Medi-Cal provider rate increases and other forms of increased reimbursement for Medi-Cal providers would also ensure dedicated funding for Medi-Cal services provided at Los Angeles County facilities.
