As a parent and family advocate, I am all too familiar with navigating these frequent followups. It is far too easy for individuals to fall through the crack when faced with prescription lapses, an overburdened healthcare system, and/or pharmacy shortages. Untreated ADHD doesn't just affect focus; it increases the risk of co-occurring conditions like anxiety and depression, worsening overall mental health. Improving access and support for those who rely on these medications is crucial.
