# Challenge

## Government Contracting is Largely Inaccessible to Small, Diverse Businesses


#### **Barriers to access include:**

- Information and education
- Hard-to-navigate processes
- Stringent requirements
- Capacity to meet contract scope and size
- Cash flow and resource limitations



In 2021, the LA County Board of Supervisors
Adopted the Motion to Establish Equity in County
Contracting (ECC) Initiative.

LSBE - Local Small Business Enterprise


DVBE - Disabled Veteran Business Enterprise

# Opportunity

## **Economic Benefits of Procurement with Small, Diverse Business**



Investing in small businesses means investing in the County's local economy and in historically disinvested owners and workers.

The majority of small businesses are owned by communities of color and majority of returns stay local, supporting wealth generation and closing the gender and racial wealth gap.



Additional revenue streams promote resiliency for small businesses.



As contracts become consistent, it advances sustainable growth for both businesses and workers.



More small business procurement can increase competition and expand qualified pool of vendors, ensuring the best goods and services are available for the public.



In FY 23-24, the County awarded \$1.1+ billion to certified small businesses:

**300%+** increase

Increased from about \$260 million in 2017 – an increase of more than 300%!

### **Key County Initiatives Making a Difference**

#### **Equity in County Contracting (ECC)**

Launched ECC in 2021 to help streamline, standardize, and provide governance for County contracting and make it easier for new and existing vendors to do business with the County.




# On Deck LA County Initiatives



- Public reporting on key County-funded projects and departmental utilization against goals
- A \$2 million Revolving Loan Fund
- A new Office of Countywide Contracting at Internal Services Department (ISD)
- A new E-Procurement system that streamlines County contracting with ISD
- Partnership with LA28/LA City and InfrastructureLA to prioritize and track local hiring and supplier diversity
- Small business advocates and a business portal for partners large and small to better navigate LA County, from getting certified, to awards, to permitting and delivery
- Streamline policies, processes, and practices




#### **NUMBER OF CONTRACTS**

# ARDI Recommendations on Equitable Contracting

- Unbundle contracts using best practices to provide more opportunities for small to midsize organizations to compete for funding.
- Explore additional opportunities to provide **technical assistance and consultation** to vendors on contracting; leverage resources provided by the Economic Recovery Initiative, previously implemented by the Center for Nonprofit Management.
  - Use suggested language when referencing proposed technical assistance and consultation services to mitigate concerns about conflicts of interest.
- Continue outreach and engagement to notify organizations of upcoming and/or current contract solicitation opportunities, as well as preference programs.





## **Unbundling Contracts - Best Practices**

As contract expiration dates approach, DHS will assess feasibility of unbundling using County best practices.



#### COMPLETED

- Housekeeping RFP released with opportunity for up to 6 contracts
- Unarmed Security RFP released with opportunity for up to 4 contracts
- Laundry Services RFP released with opportunity for up to 4 contracts



#### **COMING SOON**

- Landscaping RFP in development, anticipating opportunity for up to 6-8 contracts
- Billing Collection Services RFP in development, anticipating opportunity for up to 4 contracts



## Technical Assistance & Consultation





#### COMPLETED

- Launched a technical assistance inbox to help vendors with contracting processes, including Vendor Registration (WebVen), DEO's Preference Program certification, and other resources.
- Help vendors on the spot at networking events to address challenges.
- Housing for Health supports small organizations on contracting pathway to get on Supportive and/or Housing Services Master Agreements.

## **Coming Soon**

- Develop technical assistance resources, including proposal writing trainings to help vendors refine their proposals Spring 2025.
- Develop a model for contracting with small/new community-based organizations in partnership with more mature capacity-building organizations that will support them on a path to independence Summer 2025.



## Outreach & Engagement





#### **COMPLETED**

- All contracts solicitations are posted on the *Doing Business With Los Angeles County* website
  - Work orders under Master Agreements may only be marketed to eligible contractors.
- Ongoing attendance to outreach events in the community to promote available contracting opportunities and build a diverse applicant pool.

## **Coming Soon**

- DHS-hosted community events to recruit and attract new and diverse vendors -Summer 2025.
- Targeted engagement materials and educational resources to promote preference program certification, provide registration tips, and guide vendors through the LA County contracting process December 2024.



## Reducing Sole Source Contracts

DHS is in the process of soliciting contracts converted to sole source by extension as part of our recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic



### **Opportunities to Reduce Sole Source Limited by**

- Unique circumstances:
  - Trauma Hospitals
  - Martin Luther King, Jr. Community Hospital
  - Affiliations with Medical Schools historic, local relationships
  - Foundation/Support Groups entities fundraise, support County facilities
- Operational needs:
  - Information Technology Systems highly customized systems with limited opportunities for replacement; administratively burdensome and costly to replace
  - Original Equipment Manufacturers maintenance and repair contracts
  - Billing and Collection Services legacy services that support DHS' financial revenue operations
