## Proclaim February as Civil Grand Jury Month in Los Angeles County

Grand juries have existed since the adoption of California's original Constitution in 1849-1850, allowing ordinary citizens across California's 58 counties to take an oath and voluntarily serve a one-year term as a civil grand juror charged with examining and reporting governmental operations to ensure responsibilities are fulfilled legally, efficiently, and in the best public interest. The Los Angeles County Civil Grand Jury, due to the large scale of the County, is comprised of 23 jurors and 20 alternate jurors, making it the largest Civil Grand Jury in California.

Operating under the auspices of the Superior Court of California, the Civil Grand Jury serves as a watchdog with broad access to public officials, employees, records, and information. As an independent body of community members, the Civil Grand Jury is well suited to effectively investigate governmental bodies because it operates separately from the entities and officials they investigate. Its most important function is to review the operations of officers, departments, and agencies within local government. Through fact-finding, the Civil Grand Jury produces reports with recommendations to address issues and enhance government efficiency and responsiveness.
