  - a) Department of Economic Opportunity (DEO)
    - <u>MacArthur Park Street Cleaning and Litter Abatement Workforce</u> <u>Development Program</u> – \$2,000,000 to provide justice-involved individuals with workforce development training and employment placement while providing a critical service
    - <u>The Second District Community Beautification Workforce Development</u> <u>Program</u> – \$600,000 to provide justice-involved individuals with workforce development training and employment placement to clean and maintain public spaces and beautify the public realm
    - <u>Skid Row Action Plan (SRAP): Economic Mobility Program for</u> <u>Entrepreneurs and Job Seekers</u> – \$1,715,000 to increase access to permanent and interim housing and boost economic opportunity through various services, including an Economic Mobility Program that includes Entrepreneurship Academy and Social Services Training program
  - b) Department of Military and Veterans Affairs
    - <u>Justice-Involved Veteran Services Enhancement Initiative</u> \$625,000 to improve services and access for justice-involved veterans, addressing systemic barriers that hinder reintegration and recovery

- c) Sheriff's Department
  - <u>Court Services Transportation Bureau Bus Replacement</u>- \$5,300,000 to acquire six transportation buses to restore the level of service needed to deliver the justice-involved population in a safe and timely manner to court appearances, medical visits, and state facilities
- d) Office of Diversion and Reentry (ODR)
  - <u>Crocker Harm Reduction Health Hub Extended Drop-In Center Hours</u> \$1,000,000 to fund expanded operating hours for the drop-in center component of Crocker Harm Reduction Health Hub on Skid Row from 8 hours a day to 14 hours a day, 7 days a week
  - <u>Crocker Campus Safe Services Hub</u> \$3,406,000 to link people experiencing homelessness to services and referrals via the Crocker Campus Safe Services Hub
  - <u>ODR Navigation Team</u> \$1,509,961 to build a Navigation Team to respond to community crises with non-violent intervention to de-escalate disruptive behaviors and prevent further escalation
  - <u>Contingency Management</u> \$1,587,119 for pilot project to address the need for effective stimulant use disorder treatment by aligning with harm reduction principles and providing flexible, evidence-based support
  - <u>TGI Community Transition Program</u> \$125,000 to create an Equity Diversity Inclusion Antiracism (EDIA) informed curriculum to address the specific needs of Transgender, Gender non-conforming, and/or Intersex (TGI) individuals, including housing and Intensive Case Management Services (ICMS)
