In celebration of Mental Health Awareness Month during May 2025, and in acknowledgement that a mental health crisis exists across our County and nation, we recognize that our communities need support.

To help our communities build resilience and connection, the Los Angeles County Department of Mental Health (LACDMH) is launching this year's *Take Action for Mental Health L.A. County* campaign during the month of May, in partnership with nearly 70 community-based organizations and other County departments.

The need for mental health resources and support to heal and unite continues to grow as the nation faces a youth mental health crisis and the continued need to heal from violence in communities, persistent political and social turmoil, systemic racial injustice, worldwide atrocities, and economic uncertainties. All of these continue to take a profound toll on our collective mental health and wellbeing.

Take Action for Mental Health L.A. County will be comprised of Countywide events that promote health and healing by encouraging people to take action on their mental health for themselves and others. Developed by LACDMH, and in collaboration with the California Mental Health Services Authority (CalMHSA), *Take Action for Mental Health L.A. County* invests in local organizations, community leaders, creative individuals, and innovative ideas to strengthen community wellbeing. Throughout Mental Health Awareness Month in May, the *Take Action for Mental Health L.A. County* campaign will provide positive programming through community events, cultural experiences, and gatherings that foster togetherness, healing, and community engagement across all eight Los Angeles County service areas, five supervisorial districts, and a myriad of communities and neighborhoods. These free events will connect people of all ages and
