Re-establish the Reward Offer in the Murder of Devin Questel and Nakeysha Eddings

On Monday, August 27, 2001, 29-year-old Devin Questel and his girlfriend, 27-year-old Nakeysha Eddings, were found shot to death on Inglewood Avenue between West Hillsdale Street and Centinela Avenue, at 1:40 a.m. The couple were believed to have been walking to or from Mr. Questel’s nearby family residence. Earlier in the evening, the victims had spent time socializing and playing pool inside a nightclub located in the 1600 block of Centinela Avenue, a few blocks west of where the incident took place.

Despite an extensive investigation, the motive for the double homicide remains unknown. Investigators have speculated that they were possibly the victims of an attempted street robbery, or their deaths were possibly related to a dispute that may have stemmed from their time at the nightclub. The victims did not have any known enemies.

Inglewood Police Department (IPD) Homicide detectives believe there are possible witnesses in the neighborhood who may have seen the suspect(s) leave the area or individuals who may have information regarding the identity of those responsible. Anyone with information regarding this senseless crime is urged to contact IPD’s Homicide Unit or Crime Stoppers. The Board of Supervisors established this reward on October 8, 2024, it expired on January 8, 2025, and needs to be re-established.
