Andrew Salimian	<p>Dear Honorable Board of Supervisors,</p> <p>I am writing on behalf of the Los Angeles Conservancy in support of the motion before you on the June 17th agenda to consider the allocation of funds towards the General Hospital and West Campus. The Conservancy supports this critical funding at this stage, which will enable the stabilization of the site and accessibility improvements while planning and design progresses. The adaptive reuse and activation of the historic General Hospital and larger campus offers a unique opportunity to provide much-needed housing for Angelenos. We ask you to support the motion as recommended by the Department of Economic Opportunity.</p> <p>Centennial Partners, in collaboration with Los Angeles County and Supervisor District 1, has completed the due diligence phase of the Exclusive Negotiation Agreement (ENA) for the General Hospital and West Campus. During this phase, the team conducted detailed studies and investigations of the existing site conditions and identified several immediate issues requiring attention to ensure safety, functionality, and the preservation of key historic structures. As a result, a Stabilization Project is being proposed to address these urgent needs. This includes:</p>



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- Seismic improvements to minimize risk of collapse and enhance building life safety, while preserving the General Hospital's historic features
- A phased demolition of compromised structures on the West Campus that no longer serve a functional purpose
- Modernization of inefficient heating and cooling equipment, remediation and ADA upgrades

These improvements are necessary to promote safety and protect the integrity of the site.

The Conservancy is working with Centennial Partners to advise and provide technical assistance on the project. We believe that the plan for the site is respectful given the social and cultural importance of the General Hospital, but also adds considerable housing – both market rate and affordable – through the sustainable practice of adaptive reuse. The Eastside communities have a strong need to witness this site restored and brought back into active use. Guiding Principal #1 in County's General Plan is to Employ Smart Growth. By moving this project forward, the Board of Supervisors will align with the County's stated planning goals while preserving an important place.

Dear Honorable Board of Supervisors,

I am writing on behalf of the Los Angeles Conservancy in support of the motion before you on the June 17th agenda to consider the allocation of funds towards the General Hospital and West Campus. The Conservancy supports this critical funding at this stage, which will enable the stabilization of the site and accessibility improvements while planning and design progresses. The adaptive reuse and activation of the historic General Hospital and larger campus offers a unique opportunity to provide much-needed housing for Angelenos. We ask you to support the motion as recommended by the Department of Economic Opportunity.

Centennial Partners, in collaboration with Los Angeles County and Supervisor District 1, has completed the due diligence phase of the Exclusive Negotiation Agreement (ENA) for the General Hospital and West Campus. During this phase, the team conducted detailed studies and investigations of the existing site conditions and identified several immediate issues requiring attention to ensure safety, functionality, and the preservation of key historic structures. As a result, a Stabilization Project is being proposed to address these urgent needs. This includes:

- Seismic improvements to minimize risk of collapse and enhance building life safety, while preserving the General Hospital's historic features



- A phased demolition of compromised structures on the West Campus that no longer serve a functional purpose
- Modernization of inefficient heating and cooling equipment, remediation and ADA upgrades

These improvements are necessary to promote safety and protect the integrity of the site.

The Conservancy is working with Centennial Partners to advise and provide technical assistance on the project. We believe that the plan for the site is respectful given the social and cultural importance of the General Hospital, but also adds considerable housing – both market rate and affordable – through the sustainable practice of adaptive reuse. The Eastside communities have a strong need to witness this site restored and brought back into active use. Guiding Principal #1 in County’s General Plan is to *Employ Smart Growth*. By moving this project forward, the Board of Supervisors will align with the County’s stated planning goals while preserving an important place.





The Eastside Leadership for Equitable and Accountable Development Strategies Coalition (Eastside LEADS) eagerly supports the allocation of \$ 120,380,000 million in County funding to move forward with the critical stabilization work at the General Hospital and West Campus. We understand that this is a crucial next step in resolving the seismic and stabilizing issues that Centennial Partners identified in their site studies. We appreciate Centennial Partners' open dialogue with Health Innovation Community Partnership (HICP) members and Eastside LEADS as this process and stabilizing site studies have occurred and we look forward to continuing to engage in the next phase of this project.

Since 2017, Eastside LEADS members have provided ongoing recommendations for all Healthy Village, General Hospital, and West Campus projects. The HICP through the submission of written recommendations to the partnership, advocating for the adoption of the LA County Community Benefits Policy for Economic Development Projects, and by helping plan and execute community meetings to inform the surrounding neighborhoods about the HICP and the proposed General Hospital Reuse projects.

With \$120 million of public funding going into this stabilization project, we feel this is a meaningful opportunity to reaffirm the Partnership's vision that "the use of County assets and development in the [LA General, formerly LAC+USC] Medical Center area, is responsive to community needs and tied to near and long-term community benefits".

As a founding member of the HICP and a member of the Community Advisory Committee of this project, Eastside LEADS requests that a plan be developed with Centennial Partners and HICP partners in this next phase of development in order to secure the following site uses, services and community benefits priorities that our Coalition has advocated for throughout our 8-year membership in HICP:

- 1. Setting clear metrics for affordable housing development that meet the need for affordable housing for the lowest income households in the Eastside**
 - a. Discussion and setting of clear metrics for affordable housing units that meet the need for acutely low income and very low income households. Affordability means: 0%-40% Area Median Income (AMI) to ensure that existing residents in the Eastside are able to qualify for the new housing units.
 - b. Develop and implement a clear process that mobilizes Centennial Partners and HICP members to not only meet but surpass 30% affordable housing requirements for residential units on the project site.
 - c. Explore financing and programmatic opportunities to set aside units for a social housing model in the residential units. These could be social housing as community land trusts, tenant-worker owned housing, and/or cooperative housing models.
- 2. Affordable commercial space**
 - a. Create commercial-space opportunities that nurture and support small, local and emerging businesses such as a commissary space for street food vendors, and affordable retail-commercial spaces with preference for opportunities for local business expansion.
- 3. Local hiring**
 - a. Provide a complete plan to ensure workforce development specifically benefits the local resident population of the eastside to mitigate displacement and gentrification concerns and provide pipeline programs to living wage jobs in the near and long terms.
 - b. Require that 50% of hires for construction and permanent jobs on the campus be from residents that live within a 2 mile radius of the project site.
- 4. Provide free or low-cost parking for campus visitors, workers and patients and improve access to local transportation.**
 - a. Increase parking and improve transit and access to the campus to facilitate ease of use and limit spillover congestion impacts on the local community.
- 5. Create features and spaces that provide community services, programs and site uses identified by the public throughout the 2019 HICP community engagement meetings in**

eastside neighborhoods. These services and programs should enhance community well-being without income and immigration status restrictions.

We appreciate the County and Centennial Partners' commitment to community engagement in this process, and look forward to continued collaboration as we bring this massive redevelopment project to life. We respectfully urge the Board of Supervisors to authorize the \$120,380,000 in funding for stabilizing the General Hospital and West Campus because it is a necessary and responsible next step in this monumental redevelopment process.



Dear Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors:

The Eastside Leadership for Equitable and Accountable Development Strategies Coalition (Eastside LEADS) eagerly supports the allocation of \$ 120,380,000 million in County funding to move forward with the critical stabilization work at the General Hospital and West Campus. We understand that this is a crucial next step in resolving the seismic and stabilizing issues that Centennial Partners identified in their site studies. We appreciate Centennial Partners' open dialogue with Health Innovation Community Partnership (HICP) members and Eastside LEADS as this process and stabilizing site studies have occurred and we look forward to continuing to engage in the next phase of this project.

Since 2017, Eastside LEADS members have provided ongoing recommendations for all Healthy Village, General Hospital, and West Campus projects. The HICP through the submission of written recommendations to the partnership, advocating for the adoption of the LA County Community Benefits Policy for Economic Development Projects, and by helping plan and execute community meetings to inform the surrounding neighborhoods about the HICP and the proposed General Hospital Reuse projects.

With \$120 million of public funding going into this stabilization project, we feel this is a meaningful opportunity to reaffirm the Partnership’s vision that “the use of County assets and development in the [LA General, formerly LAC+USC] Medical Center area, is responsive to community needs and tied to near and long-term community benefits”.

As a founding member of the HICP and a member of the Community Advisory Committee of this project, Eastside LEADS requests that a plan be developed with Centennial Partners and HICP partners in this next phase of development in order to secure the following site uses, services and community benefits priorities that our Coalition has advocated for throughout our 8-year membership in HICP:

- 1. Setting clear metrics for affordable housing development that meet the need for affordable housing for the lowest income households in the Eastside**
 - a. Discussion and setting of clear metrics for affordable housing units that meet the need for acutely low income and very low income households. Affordability means: 0%-40% Area Median Income (AMI) to ensure that existing residents in the Eastside are able to qualify for the new housing units.
 - b. Develop and implement a clear process that mobilizes Centennial Partners and HICP members to not only meet but surpass 30% affordable housing requirements for residential units on the project site.
 - c. Explore financing and programmatic opportunities to set aside units for a social housing model in the residential units. These could be social housing as community land trusts, tenant-worker owned housing, and/or cooperative housing models.
- 2. Affordable commercial space**
 - a. Create commercial-space opportunities that nurture and support small, local and emerging businesses such as a commissary space for street food vendors, and affordable retail-commercial spaces with preference for opportunities for local business expansion.
- 3. Local hiring**
 - a. Provide a complete plan to ensure workforce development specifically benefits the local resident population of the eastside to mitigate displacement and gentrification concerns and provide pipeline programs to living wage jobs in the near and long terms.
 - b. Require that 50% of hires for construction and permanent jobs on the campus be from residents that live within a 2 mile radius of the project site.
- 4. Provide free or low-cost parking for campus visitors, workers and patients and improve access to local transportation.**
 - a. Increase parking and improve transit and access to the campus to facilitate ease of use and limit spillover congestion impacts on the local community.
- 5. Create features and spaces that provide community services, programs and site uses identified by the public throughout the 2019 HICP community engagement meetings in**

eastside neighborhoods. These services and programs should enhance community well-being without income and immigration status restrictions.

We appreciate the County and Centennial Partners' commitment to community engagement in this process, and look forward to continued collaboration as we bring this massive redevelopment project to life. We respectfully urge the Board of Supervisors to authorize the \$120,380,000 in funding for stabilizing the General Hospital and West Campus because it is a necessary and responsible next step in this monumental redevelopment process.
