**Re-establish and Increase the Reward Offer in the Murder of Reginald Thompson Sr.**

On January 11, 2022, at approximately 9:00 p.m., deputies from the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department (LASD) responded to the parking lot of a shopping center located near the southwest corner of Imperial Highway and Vermont Avenue, in the unincorporated area of Westmont, to investigate the shooting of 34-year-old Reginald Thompson Sr. Mr. Thompson was in the parking lot talking to friends when four suspects parked and exited their vehicle on Vermont Avenue just south of the shopping center and approached, firing several rounds. Mr. Thompson was struck by the gunfire and later succumbed to his injuries at a local hospital. The suspects fled the location heading south in a dark-colored sedan.

Mr. Thompson's family is devastated by this loss. LASD detectives believe there are witnesses in the neighborhood who may have seen the suspects leave the area or who know their identities. This reward was established on April 19, 2022, and expired on October 17, 2022. Re-establishing this reward could help in solving the case. Any individuals with information about this senseless crime are urged to contact LASD's Homicide Bureau or Crime Stoppers.

**I THEREFORE MOVE THAT THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS:**

Re-establish and increase the reward from the amount of \$20,000 to \$25,000 in exchange for information leading to the apprehension and conviction of the persons
