			Hector Ramirez	<p>Public Comment Regarding Intensified Immigration Enforcement in Los Angeles County</p> <p>To the Honorable Board of Supervisors,</p>

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My name is Hector M. Ramirez. I express grave concerns regarding the intensified immigration enforcement operations by the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) in Los Angeles County, which began on June 6, 2025. I strongly urge this Board to support the motion put forth by Supervisors Solis and Horvath to immediately explore all legal remedies to protect the civil rights of our residents.

The statistics detailed in the motion are alarming and demand immediate action. Over 1,600 individuals have been taken from their homes and workplaces, with numerous arrests occurring in public spaces, including churches. The deployment of 4,000 California National Guard personnel and hundreds of U.S. Marines in our county for immigration enforcement, against the wishes of the Governor, represents an unprecedented and deeply troubling show of force.

These actions, characterized by federal agents operating in unmarked vehicles, without visible badges, and often with masked faces, have led to indiscriminate detentions, including those of U.S. citizens. There are multiple reports of individuals being questioned and detained without judicial warrants or reasonable suspicion, strongly suggesting racial profiling within our established immigrant communities. Such practices violate fundamental constitutional protections against unreasonable searches and seizures, which apply to all persons within our borders.

The "Principles of Equity," which guide the LA County Community Prevention and Population Health Taskforce, clearly state that "Every person living in LA County should have an equal opportunity to live a long, healthy life." The current enforcement tactics directly undermine this principle by creating an environment of fear that is severely impacting the health and welfare of our residents. When immigrant residents and their U.S. citizen family members are afraid to go to work, visit grocery stores, attend medical appointments, or send their children to school, our entire community suffers. This also has a significant negative impact on our County's economy.

We must remember the principle of "INCLUSION," which recognizes that residents hold expertise on the impacts of social injustices on their communities. Our residents are experiencing these impacts firsthand. The County has a responsibility to build healthy communities and provide needed resources, and this includes protecting residents from unconstitutional actions that lead to poorer health and safety outcomes.

Furthermore, the principle of "ACCOUNTABILITY" dictates that LA County operates with a sense of urgency and responsibility to achieve racial, social, and environmental equity. Allowing these unconstitutional actions to continue without vigorous legal challenge would be a dereliction of that responsibility.

Therefore, I strongly support the motion to direct County Counsel to immediately explore all available legal remedies to prevent federal law

				<p>enforcement personnel from engaging in unconstitutional or unlawful immigration enforcement, including unlawful stops, questioning, detentions, or arrests without probable cause or a valid warrant.
