Preserving Temporary Protected Status for Vulnerable Populations

Los Angeles County is home to large, long-settled communities of immigrants from Honduras and Nicaragua. On July 7th, the U.S. Department of Homeland Security abruptly announced the termination of Temporary Protected Status (TPS) within 60 days for nationals of Honduras and Nicaragua who are currently protected by TPS. These terminations impact over 50,000 individuals nationwide, including several thousand in the County, all of whom have resided lawfully in the U.S. for at least 26 years. During this time, these individuals have undergone numerous application processes requiring extensive background checks, and they are deeply settled members of our community. Despite their deep family ties and economic contributions, they now face the imminent threat of deportation with virtually no transition period. Sadly, Honduran and Nicaraguan nationals are not alone. In recent months, the Administration has terminated TPS for nationals of various countries, including Haiti, Venezuela, and even Afghanistan.

WE, THEREFORE, MOVE that the Board of Supervisors suspend Section 22.1 of the Rules of the Board for the limited purpose of considering this motion.

MOTION

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WE, FURTHER, MOVE that the Board of Supervisors direct County Counsel, in consultation with the Office of Immigrant Affairs in the Department of Consumer and Business Affairs, to continue to file and/or join an amicus brief in any ongoing or imminent litigation opposing the termination of TPS for Los Angeles County residents in danger of deportation due to TPS terminations since January 2025, including but not limited to nationals of Honduras and Nicaragua.¹
