So this motion is a legislative support motion to support Assembly Bill 11/27, which was introduced by assembly members Jessie Gabriel and Katherine Stefani, and the aim of this bill would be to prohibit the sale of these specific types of guns that can be easily converted into.

Fully automatic assault weapons.

So currently, assault rifles assault firearms are illegal in California.

They have been since 1989, but semi automatic weapons are not and some semi automatic guns are designed in a way that allows them to be converted into fully automatic assault weapons with the use of this small device called a switch and these switches are often 3.

D printed so people can make them at home.

And once you add it to a semi automatic weapon.

Basically converts it into a fully automatic assault rifle or a machine gun.

And this has been happening more and more often. From 2017 to 2021.

Law enforcement agencies reported a 570% increase in seizures of these types of

weapons compared to the previous five years.

And so, but despite this growing concern, some gun manufacturers are refusing to modify their gun designs to prevent these easy the easy conversion of these weapons.

Into machine guns.

And so firearm dealers are continuing to sell these types of semi automatic weapons. So this bill would prohibit licensed firearm dealers from selling, offering for sale, exchanging or in other ways delivering any semi automatic pistols in California that are easily convertible into fully automatic machine guns.

This bill is going into the Senate Appropriations Committee on August 18th. So we are getting the board support out if if all offices support it by August 12th, which will be the two weeks that it'll be on the board agenda. I don't think CEO Lar is here but if anyone has questions, I'm sure they'd be happy to follow. Up.
