			raneisha hubbert	<p>?? Public Comment Statement – Raneisha Hubbert</p> <p>Good morning, Supervisors. My name is Raneisha Hubbert.</p> <p>I am speaking today as a taxpaying citizen and a mother. While millions of dollars are being directed toward immigrant programs, families like mine — U.S. citizens — are being ignored. I cannot even get an attorney to represent me in my child custody case, and DCFS refuses to provide my family with a Section 8 voucher that would stabilize our home.</p> <p>We are tired of seeing our resources handed out while citizens are left without support. I have cooperated fully — the police saw my son, the social worker saw my son — and still, instead of a voucher, I was given a list of shelters. That is not housing.</p> <p>I also want to put on record that DCFS Supervisor Kendra failed in her duty as a mandatory reporter when my 17-year-old daughter, who is in DCFS care, was locked out in 101-degree heat. Her baby was at school at the time, but my daughter was still left outside with no support. Instead of taking the report, Kendra told her to “call the hotline.” That is unacceptable. I demanded her to take report and reminded her she is a mandatory reporter and under cos care</p>
