ENHANCING PARKING ENFORCEMENT SERVICES – QUARTERLY REPORT (ITEM NO. 85-C, AGENDA OF APRIL 9, 2024, AND ITEM NO. 10, AGENDA OF JULY 9, 2024)

On April 9, 2024, the Board of Supervisors (Board) directed the Chief Executive Officer, in coordination with the Department of Public Works (DPW) and the Sheriff's Department (Sheriff), to provide quarterly reports to the Board on the status of improvements and enhancements of parking enforcement services, including a number of performance metrics. On July 9, 2024, the Board further directed the Chief Executive Office (CEO) to report on additional data elements in the quarterly reports.

Updates on the Implementation of Assembly Bill (AB) 413

The Sheriff's Parking Enforcement Detail (PED) and DPW have continued to conduct public outreach and take further steps to implement enforcement of AB 413, which prohibits parking within 20 feet of any crosswalk regardless of whether the curb is marked or not. As of June 2025, DPW has completed painting red curbs at all 679 intersections identified as priority AB 413 red curb locations which are included in Attachment I. Additional red curbs near intersections continue to be added per constituent or PED request, as well as added to roadway improvement projects. DPW also drafted an ordinance amendment to establish a bail (fine) amount for AB 413 violations, with the final ordinance expected to be presented to the Board for adoption on September 16, 2025. The proposed fine for AB 413 violations has been set at \$50 dollars plus administrative fees for a total of \$63, which would match the existing penalty issued for red curb violations.

While awaiting adoption of the AB 413 bail ordinance, vehicles parked in violation of AB 413 near intersections without updated red curbs have been receiving warning citations by PED officers. During the last reporting period of April-June 2025, PED has issued 783 warning citations (handwritten and electronic) for AB 413 violations.

Parking Enforcement Metrics Report and Informational Updates

The attached PED report (Attachment II) includes metrics identified by the Board in the April 9, 2024, and July 9, 2024, motions. These metrics feature data collected from April through June 2025 including: Violation Rates, Revenue Generation, Response Time, Appeals and Dispute, Customer Satisfaction, Equity and Accessibility, Safety Improvements, Efficiency of Resources, Environmental Impact, and Community Engagement.

Additional parking enforcement updates from DPW include:

- Community Engagement: DPW continues to regularly attend community meetings with Parking Enforcement. Since February 2025, DPW has attended 37 community meetings throughout the County of Los Angeles (County) with PED including Chapman Woods community meetings, Avalon Gardens community meetings, El Camino Village Neighborhood Watch meetings, East Rancho Dominguez Neighborhood Association meetings, Florence-Firestone Community Leaders meetings, Castaic small business owners meeting, Maravilla Community Advisory Committee meetings, Rowland Heights community meetings, North Whittier-Avocado Heights community meetings, Wiseburn Watch community meetings, Vision City Terrace community meetings, and various Non-Conforming Vehicle outreach meetings in multiple unincorporated communities.
- Areas Mapped and Assessed for Non-Enforcement Solutions: DPW is undergoing
 a major mapping effort to digitize all of its road infrastructure assets into GIS
 maps which will include traffic and parking signage and corresponding
 restrictions. DPW is working with the Internal Services Department (ISD) on the
 contract for data collection to assist with the mapping efforts. Approval of the
 contract related to this project is currently anticipated to go to the Board (via
 ISD) in October 2025. DPW continues work with PED to identify specific
 locations of concern and develop policy changes to help address these issues.
- Non-Enforcement Solutions Initiated and Completed and Outcomes: Since
 February 2025, DPW has completed 282 requests in unincorporated
 communities related to parking regulations (Attachment III). These requests in
 41 different unincorporated communities include blue curb requests, red curb
 requests, street sweeping, parking restrictions, and other signage or parking
 issues. Included in these counts are 76 requests initiated directly by the

Sheriff's PED. Some results of these completed requests include 107 new blue parking curbs being added in unincorporated areas to increase parking access to those with disabilities, and 62 new requests for street sweeping signage to reduce parked vehicles in neighborhoods receiving street sweeping services.

<u>Updates on Reporting of Parking Issues in The Works App</u>

DPW and PED have been collaborating to allow constituents to report parking issues via the DPW's The Works app. Information Technology teams from DPW and Sheriff are working together to develop a connection between The Works app and the Sheriff's Parking Enforcement portal.

Parking Meter Update

DPW has completed contract negotiations with the parking meter contractor and services will be discontinued by the end of September 2025. DPW has removed the approximately 225 parking meters that the County maintains in order to explore more cost-effective alternatives. DPW anticipates installing time limit restriction parking signs in their place during this next quarter.

AB 413 Daylighting Law

April - June 2025

22500(n)(1)(A)CVC - The California law prohibits stopping / standing / parking within 20 feet of the vehicle approach side of any marked or unmarked crosswalk or within 15 feet of any crosswalk where a curb extension is present. This practice increases visibility of pedestrians or cyclists for drivers, reducing the risk of pedestrian-involved crashes, also known as "daylighting".


