Re: Ordinance Amending Title 8 - Right of Recall and Right of Retention - OPPOSE

Dear LA County Board of Supervisors,

The Valley Industry and Commerce Association (VICA) opposes the proposed ordinance that would make permanent the County's COVID-19 Right of Recall and Right of Retention policies. While these measures were initially adopted as temporary emergency responses during the pandemic, extending them indefinitely undermines the County's economic recovery and imposes undue burdens on employers.

This ordinance, which renumbers Chapter 8.201 as Chapter 8.22 and Chapter 8.202 as Chapter 8.23, would require commercial property owners, hospitality employers, and related businesses to permanently rehire and retain employees under rigid recall and transition requirements. These mandates significantly limit employers' flexibility to make staffing decisions based on current business needs, performance, and evolving market conditions. The continued enforcement of these pandemic-era rules risks deterring investment, slowing business recovery, and discouraging job creation in the Los Angeles region.

The hospitality, property management, and service industries have faced severe financial strain over the last several years, and many are only beginning to stabilize. A permanent recall and retention requirement forces businesses to take on additional compliance, legal, and financial risks at a time when they should be focused on regrowth and innovation. This does not just hurt employers—it threatens long-term stability for employees as well, since businesses constrained by inflexible regulations may be less able to expand operations or hire new workers.

Moreover, these policies duplicate or conflict with existing city ordinances in Los Angeles, Santa Monica, and West Hollywood, creating inconsistent and overlapping rules that confuse compliance efforts and raise the cost of doing business in the County. Businesses need clarity and consistency, not additional layers of permanent regulation that were never intended to extend beyond the emergency conditions of COVID-19.

For these reasons, VICA urges your opposition to the ordinance amending Title 8 to make the Right of Recall and Right of Retention permanent.

Subject: Please Support Items 61 & 62 - Protections for Hospitality Workers

#### Honorable Chair Barger and Members of the Board of Supervisors:

We, the undersigned community organizations in Los Angeles County, support the proposed Hotel Worker Protection Ordinance and Worker Retention Ordinance (Items 61 & 62).

Los Angeles County attracts visitors from around the world, which supports a robust hospitality industry. Hotel housekeepers are the backbone of the hotel industry and deserve to be fairly compensated for their hard work. They are asking for basic workplace protections, like panic buttons, that exist in other cities, like Santa Monica, Long Beach, Oakland, the City of Los Angeles, Santa Monica, West Hollywood, and Glendale. They are asking to be protected from sexual assault and other threatening conduct, and to ensure that they are fairly compensated for heavy workloads.

During the pandemic, the County passed temporary right-of-recall and right-of-retention ordinances that required employers to hire back laid-off workers and keep staff when businesses changed hands. Those measures kept families stable and our local economy moving. Similar protections are already law in the City of Los Angeles, Long Beach, Glendale, Santa Monica, and West Hollywood. They have worked effectively for many years at Los Angeles International Airport. It is time that those who work in unincorporated Los Angeles County have the same protections. We urge you to make those protections permanent.

Please stand with our county's hospitality workers by passing both the comprehensive Hotel Worker Protection Ordinance and the Worker Retention Ordinance (Items 61 & 62).

Our organizations call on this Board to pass these ordinances, without delay. Let us demonstrate that our County stands with our hospitality workers. Thank you.




