SUBJECT

Approval of Conflict of Interest Codes.

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT THE BOARD:

Approve the Conflict of Interest Codes for County Counsel, Economic Opportunity Department, Justice, Care and Opportunities Department, Public Works Department, San Gabriel Valley Council of Governments, Saugus Union School District, and codes impacted by SB 852 which include Beverly Hills Unified School District, Horizons Plan Administrative Committee, Kinneloa Irrigation District, LACERA, LACERA Wholly-Owned Title Holding Companies, Los Angeles County Sanitation Districts, Metropolitan Transportation Authority (MTA), Palos Verdes Peninsula Unified School District, Pasadena Glen Community Services District, Pension Savings Plan Administrative Committee, Rio Hondo Community College District, Rowland Water District, San Gabriel Basin Water Quality Authority, Savings Plan Administrative Committee, STEM Preparatory Schools, Treasurer and Tax Collector, William S. Hart Joint School Financing Authority, William S. Hart Union High School District, ABC Unified School District, Auditor-Controller, Baldwin Park Unified School District, Cerritos Community College District, El Monte City School District, Mountain View School District, and South Montebello Irrigation District to be effective the day following your Board's approval.

PURPOSE/JUSTIFICATION OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

Pursuant to Government Code Section 87300, every local government agency must adopt and

promulgate a Conflict of Interest Code. Agencies are required to amend their Conflict of Interest Codes when necessitated by changed circumstances pursuant to Government Code Section 87306.

In accordance with the Political Reform Act of 1974, the Board of Supervisors is the code reviewing body for Los Angeles County. The Board of Supervisors must approve an agency's code before it can take effect.

The proposed Conflict of Interest Codes have been thoroughly reviewed and approved by the code review staff in accordance with the procedures established by your Board.

Implementation of Strategic Plan Goals

Your Board's approval of the Conflict of Interest Codes will further the County's Strategic Plan North Star 3- Realize Tomorrow's Government Today, Focus Area A- Communication & Public Strategy I.-Customer Service.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING

Local governmental agencies must have a Conflict of Interest Code in which individuals in designated positions are required to disclose financial interests at a level appropriate to their decision-making authority.

Adoption of a Conflict of Interest Code deters potential conflicts of interest, thereby averting misuse of public funds.

The recommended action has no effect on budget revenues or expenditures.

Incorporation of FPPC Regulation 18730 (2 California Code of Regulations, Section 18730) by Reference

The Political Reform Act (Government Code Section 81000, et seq.) requires state and local government agencies to adopt and promulgate conflict of interest codes. The Fair Political Practices Commission has adopted a regulation (2 Cal. Code of Regs. Section 18730), which contains the terms of a standard conflict of interest code. After public notice and hearing, it may be amended by the Fair Political Practices Commission to conform to amendments in the Political Reform Act. Therefore, the terms of 2 California Code of Regulations Section 18730, and any amendments to it duly adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission, are hereby incorporated by reference into the Public Works Department ("Agency") conflict-of-interest conflict of interest code of this agency by reference. This regulation and the attached Appendices (or Exhibit) designating officials and employees and establishing economic disclosure categories shall constitute the conflict-of-interest code of this Agency.

Place of Filing of Statements of Economic Interests

All officials and employees required to submit a Statement of Economic Interests (Statement") shall file their Statements with the Agency head, or his or her designee. The Agency shall make and retain a copy of all Statements filed by its Director and forward the original of such Statement to the Executive Office of the Board of Supervisors of Los Angeles County.

The **A**gency shall retain the originals of **S**tatements for all other Designated Positions named in the **A**gency's conflict of interest code. All retained **S**tatements, original or copied, shall be available for public inspection and reproduction (Gov. Code Section 81008).

PUBLIC WORKS, DEPARTMENT OF EXHIBIT "A"

CATEGORY 1

Persons in this category shall disclose all interest in real property within the jurisdiction. Real property shall be deemed to be within the jurisdiction if the property or any part of it is located within or not more than two miles outside the boundaries of the jurisdiction or within two miles of any land owned or used by the **A**gency.

Persons are not required to disclose a residence, such as a home or vacation cabin, used exclusively as a personal residence; however, a residence in which a person rents out a room or for which a person claims a business deduction may be reportable.

CATEGORY 2

Persons in this category shall disclose all investments and business positions.

CATEGORY 3

Persons in this category shall disclose all income (including gifts, loans and travel payments) and business positions.

CATEGORY 4

Persons in this category shall disclose all business positions, investments in, or income (including gifts, loans and travel payments) received from:

(A) Business entities that manufacture, provide or sell services and/or supplies of a type utilized by the **A**gency and associated with the job assignment of designated positions assigned this category; and

(B) Business entities that are subject to inspection or enforcement action by the designated positions in their capacity as employees of the Department of Public Works Agency under provisions of the Los Angeles County Building, Mechanical, Plumbing, Electrical, or Zoning Code Enforcement, or subject to the Clean Water Act, California Environmental Quality Act, California Integrated Waste Management Act, National Environmental Pollution Act, California Health and Safety Code, Titles 11, 12 and 20 of the Los Angeles County Code, or subject to plan checks or approvals for grading, drainage, geological studies, industrial waste, underground tank storage of hazardous substances, land use permit compliance, refuse collection & waste diversion services, right-of-way acquisition or appraisal by the County of Los Angeles or any special districts therein.

Depending upon the specific job assignment of the designated position, these business entities shall include but are not limited to:

- (1) Businesses involved in land speculation or development for purposes of subdivision, grading, residential or commercial/industrial development, land filling, mineral exploitation or mining.
- (2) Any engineering, architectural or other firm preparing plans and reports for construction.
- (3) Any firm of consulting engineers, geologists or similar specialties submitting reports for approval by the Director of Public Works the Agency;
- (4) Any testing firms or laboratories.
- (5) Any supplier of building systems, materials and services.
- (6) Businesses entities involved in the collection, processing, transportation, and/or disposal of solid and/or hazardous waste.
- (7) Businesses entities involved in the construction, installation, modification, or removal of underground hazardous materials storage tanks or industrial waste control or disposal facilities.
- (8) Any firm of engineers, biologists, environmental consultants/planners, public relations consultants, landscape architects, land use planners, ecologist or similar specialties submitting studies, reports or plans for approval or providing services to the Department of Public Works Agency.

CATEGORY 6

Persons in this category shall disclose all income from any Department of Public-Works Agency employee, any representative or association of such employee, and business positions or income (including gifts, loans and travel payments) from any entity owned or controlled by such employee or his/her spouse or other financial dependent.

The Chief Engineer and General Manager or his or her designee may determine in writing that a particular consultant or new position, although a "designated position," is hired to perform a range of duties that is limited in scope and thus is not required to fully comply with disclosure requirements in this section. Such written determination shall include a description of the consultant's or new position's duties and, based upon that description, a statement of the extent of disclosure requirements. The Chief Engineer and General Manager or his or her designee's determination is a public record and shall be retained for public inspection in the same manner and location as this conflict-of-interest code. (Gov. Code Section 81008.)

Copies of the forms to be used shall be supplied by the Ethics Officer. Every MTA public official holding a position designated in Appendix A to the Conflict of Interest Code shall retain his or her filing obligations, notwithstanding any reclassification or title change that may occur in the future as to the same or substantially similar job duties.

Persons are not required to disclose a residence, such as a home or vacation cabin, used exclusively as a personal residence; however, a residence in which a person rents out a room or for which a person claims a business deduction may be reportable.

The Agency shall retain the originals of Statements for all other Designated Positions named in the Agency's conflict of interest code. All retained Statements, original or copied, shall be available for public inspection and reproduction (Gov. Code Section 81008).

The **A**gency shall make and retain a copy of all **Statements** filed by its Board Members, and General Manager and forward the originals of such **Statements** to the Executive Office of the Board of Supervisors of Los Angeles County.

The Agency shall retain the originals of Statements for all other Designated Positions named in the Agency's conflict of interest code. All retained Statements, original or copied, shall be available for public inspection and reproduction (Gov. Code Section 81008).

<u>Category 1</u>: All investments and business positions, and income including gifts, loans and travel payments from sources that are located in, do business or own real property within the jurisdiction of the <u>District</u> **Agency**.

<u>Category 2</u>: All interests in real property which is located in whole or in part within, or not more than two (2) miles outside, the boundaries of the <u>District Agency</u>.

<u>Category 3</u>: All investments and business positions, income, including gifts, loans and travel payments from sources that are engaged in land development, construction or the acquisition or sale of real property within the jurisdiction of the <u>District Agency</u>.

<u>Category 4</u>: All investments and business positions in, and income gifts, loans, and travel payments from sources that provide services, products, materials, machinery, vehicles or equipment of a type purchased or leased by the <u>District Agency</u>.

<u>Category 5</u>: All investments and business positions, and income including gifts, loans, and travel payments from sources that provide services, supplies, products materials, machinery, vehicles or equipment of a type purchased or leased by the Designated Employee's Department, Unit or Division.
