RESOLUTION NO. 26-13

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INGLEWOOD, CALIFORNIA, CALLING FOR AND GIVING NOTICE OF THE HOLDING OF A GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON TUESDAY, JUNE 2, 2026, FOR THE SUBMISSION OF A PROPOSED ORDINANCE TO THE VOTERS

WHEREAS, under the provisions of the laws of the State of California and the Charter of the City of Inglewood, a General Municipal Election may be held on Tuesday, June 2, 2026; and

WHEREAS, on September 30, 2025, the City Council received and filed a report from the City Clerk certifying that an initiative petition for A Proposed Ordinance to Amend the Inglewood Fire Code to Permit the Sale and Use of Certain Fireworks within the City of Inglewood ("Fireworks Ordinance" or "Measure") received sufficient signatures to qualify for the ballot; and

WHEREAS, on September 30, 2025, the City Council adopted a resolution ordering the submission of the Fireworks Ordinance to the voters at the June 2, 2026 General Municipal Election to be consolidated with the 2026 California Primary Election to be held the same date;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INGLEWOOD, CALIFORNIA, DOES RESOLVE, DECLARE, DETERMINE AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. That pursuant to the requirements of the laws of the State of California and the Charter of the City of Inglewood, there is called and ordered to be held in the City of Inglewood, California, on Tuesday, June 2, 2026, a General Municipal Election for the purpose of submitting the following proposed Fireworks Ordinance:

SECTION 2. That the proposed complete text of the measure (ordinance) submitted to the voters is attached as Exhibit A.

SECTION 3. That the vote requirement for the measure to pass is a majority (50% + 1) of the votes cast by the qualified electors of the City of Inglewood.

SECTION 4. That the ballots to be used at the election shall be in form and content as required by law.

SECTION 5. That the City Clerk is authorized, instructed and directed to coordinate with the County of Los Angeles Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk to procure and furnish any and all official ballots, notices, printed matter and all supplies, equipment and paraphernalia that may be necessary in order to properly and lawfully conduct the election.

SECTION 6. That the vote centers for the election shall be open at 7 a.m. of the day of the election, and shall be kept open until 8 p.m. of the same day, when the polls shall be closed, pursuant to Elections Code section 10242, except as provided in Elections Code sections 4005, 14401 and 14212.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INGLEWOOD, CALIFORNIA, REQUESTING THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES TO CONSOLIDATE A GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON TUESDAY, JUNE 2, 2026, WITH THE STATEWIDE PRIMARY ELECTION TO BE HELD ON THE SAME DATE PURSUANT TO SECTION 10403 OF THE ELECTIONS CODE

WHEREAS, the Inglewood City Council called a General Municipal Election to be held on Tuesday, June 2, 2026, for the purpose of submitting a proposed ordinance to the voters of the City; and

WHEREAS, it is desirable that the City's General Municipal Election be consolidated with the Statewide Primary Election to be held on the same date and that within the City the precincts, vote centers, and election officers of the two elections be the same, and that the county election department of the County of Los Angeles canvass the returns of the General Municipal Election and that the election be held in all respects as if there were only one election; and

WHEREAS, Elections Code section 10002 authorizes the City to request by resolution that the Board of Supervisors authorize the county elections official to conduct specified election services;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INGLEWOOD, CALIFORNIA, DOES RESOLVE, DECLARE, DETERMINE AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. That pursuant to the requirements of §10403 of the Elections Code, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles is hereby requested to consent and agree to the consolidation of a General Municipal Election with the Statewide Primary Election on Tuesday, June 2, 2026, for the purpose of submitting a proposed ordinance (measure) to the voters.

SECTION 2.	That the	measure	appear	on	the	ballot	as	follows:

SECTION 3. That the text of the ordinance submitted to the voters is attached as Exhibit Λ .

SECTION 4. That the vote requirement for the measure to pass is a majority (50% + 1) of the votes cast by the qualified electors of the City of Inglewood.

SECTION 5. That the county elections official is authorized to canvass the returns of the General Municipal Election. The election shall be held in all respects as if there were only one election, and only one form of ballot shall be used. The election will be held and conducted in accordance with the provisions of law regulating the statewide or special election, including but not limited to Elections Code section 10418.

SECTION 6. That the Board of Supervisors is requested to issue instructions to the county elections official to take any and all steps necessary for the holding of the consolidated election.

SECTION 7. That the City of Inglewood recognizes that additional costs will be incurred by the County by reason of this consolidation and agrees to reimburse the County for any costs.
