## Third District Funding for Rebuilding the Palisades-Malibu YMCA

The 2025 Palisades Fire destroyed over 6,800 structures, devastating the Pacific Palisades community, including homes, businesses, and community centers. Among the buildings destroyed was the Palisades-Malibu YMCA.

Since the 1960's, the Palisades-Malibu YMCA has been more than just a facility – it has been foundational to the community. Generations of families, students, and neighbors have found a home at the Palisades-Malibu YMCA, where programs and services have fostered growth, health, and connection.

The Palisades-Malibu YMCA has earned a cornerstone position in the Palisades and surrounding areas as a non-denominational and community-based organization, welcoming all regardless of background, faith, or belief. From early childhood programs to youth sports, from senior wellness initiatives to civic engagement, the Palisades-Malibu YMCA has served as a gathering place that strengthens the fabric of the community.

The loss of the beloved Palisades-Malibu YMCA has left a profound gap in the shared experience of the community. For local families, it was a hub of connection, a place where teens built leadership skills, and older adults found friendship and well-MOTION

being. Students from Palisades Charter High School and across the region relied on the Palisades-Malibu YMCA as a safe and welcoming space to grow.

Since January, the Palisades-Malibu YMCA has been planning the rebuilding and expansion of their facilities in the Pacific Palisades, including an upgraded 10,000 square foot facility with enhanced community resources, including: a 10,000 square foot outdoor pool; outdoor basketball court; bocce court; baseball diamond; and facility enhancements including expanding youth and wellness space. The new upgraded facility will provide critical community resources and programs, including: swim safety and drowning prevention programs at the outdoor pool; multi-purpose spaces for emergency response coordination; community rooms for support groups; rebuilding assistance and mental health programs; fitness facilities for holistic health and stress management; outdoor recreation; and programing at the baseball diamond, bocce court, and gymnasium.

To support the rebuilding of the Palisades-Malibu YMCA, the County proposes a \$4.0 million contribution in Fiscal-Year 2025-26 using the Third Supervisorial District's Board community programs funding as follows: \$2.063 million set aside in the Provisional Financing Uses budget unit and \$1.937 million in the Board of Supervisors budget unit.

## **I, THEREFORE, MOVE** that the Board of Supervisors:

Approve the attached appropriation adjustment to transfer \$2,063,000 from the Provisional Financing Uses budget unit to the Board of Supervisors operating budget to support rebuilding efforts of the Palisades-Malibu YMCA.
