## CHALLENGES & MITIGATION STRATEGIES

- **Operational Cost Increases and Added Unfunded Mandates**
  - Additional State Language Designations (23 total languages)
  - Proposed additional language on ballot measures — increased ballot length
  - Demand for rapid canvassing, expansive voting options, reduced USPS service
- **Compounding Operational Risks**
  - Executive Orders, Litigation, and Misinformation
  - USPS Policy Change and business stability
  - Cyber and Physical Security
- **Funding and Fee Stabilization**
  - Real estate transaction forecasting
  - Recorder-Clerk operations & cost recovery deficits
  - Increasing election costs = fiscal pressure on local jurisdictions
