RESOLUTION NO. 26-03

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA MIRADA, CALIFORNIA, CALLING FOR A GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON TUESDAY, JUNE 2, 2026, FOR THE ELECTION OF CERTAIN OFFICERS AS REQUIRED BY THE PROVISIONS OF THE LAWS OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA RELATING TO GENERAL LAW CITIES

A. Recitals.

- (i) Under the provisions of the laws relating to general law cities in the State of California, a General Municipal Election shall be held on June 2, 2026, for the election of Municipal Officers.
- (ii) All legal prerequisites to the adoption of this Resolution have occurred.

B. Resolution.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of La Mirada, California, does hereby resolve, declare, determine and order as follows:

1. The City Council hereby specifically finds that all of the facts set forth in the Recitals, Part A, of this Resolution are true and correct.
2. Pursuant to the requirements of the laws of the State of California relating to General Law Cities, there is called and ordered to be held in the City of La Mirada, California, on Tuesday, June 2, 2026, a General Municipal Election for the purpose of electing two Members of the City Council from Districts 1 and 2 for the full term of four years.
3. The ballots to be used at the election shall be in form and content as required by law.
4. The City Clerk is authorized, instructed and directed to coordinate with the County of Los Angeles Registrar-Recorder to procure and furnish any and all official ballots, notices, printed matter and all supplies, equipment and paraphernalia that may be necessary in order to properly and lawfully conduct the election.
5. The polls for the election shall be open at 7:00 a.m. of the day of the election and shall remain open continuously from that time until 8:00 p.m. of the same day when the polls shall be closed, pursuant to Election Code § 10242, except as provided in § 14401 of the Elections Code of the State of California.

6. In all particulars not recited in this resolution, the election shall be held and conducted as provided by law for holding municipal elections.
7. Notice of the time and place of holding the election is given and the City Clerk is authorized, instructed and directed to give further or additional notice of the election, in time, form and manner as required by law.
8. The City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this Resolution and enter it into the book of original Resolutions.
9. The City Council authorizes the City Clerk to administer said election and all reasonable and actual election expenses shall be paid by the City upon presentation of a properly submitted bill.

RESOLUTION NO. 26-04

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA MIRADA REQUESTING THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES TO CONSOLIDATE A GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON JUNE 2, 2026 WITH THE STATEWIDE PRIMARY ELECTION PURSUANT TO § 10403 OF THE ELECTIONS CODE

A. Recitals.

- (i) The City Council of the City of La Mirada will hold a General Municipal Election to be held on Tuesday, June 2, 2026, for the purpose of the election of two Members of the City Council.
- (ii) It is desirable that the General Municipal Election be consolidated with the Statewide Primary Election to be held on the same date and that within the City the precincts, polling places, and election officers of the two elections be the same, and that the County Elections Official canvass the returns of the General Municipal Election, and that the election be held in all respects as if there were only one election.

B. Resolution.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of La Mirada, California, does hereby resolve, declare, determine and order as follows:

- 1. That pursuant to the requirements of § 10403 of the Elections Code, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles is hereby requested to consent and agree to the consolidation of a General Municipal Election with the Statewide Primary Election on Tuesday, June 2, 2026, for the purpose of the election of two Members of the City Council.
- 2. The County election department is authorized to canvass the returns of the General Municipal Election. The election shall be held in all respects as if there were only one election, and only one form of ballot shall be used. The election will be held and conducted in accordance with the provisions of law regulating the statewide or special election.
- 3. That the Board of Supervisors is requested to issue instructions to the County election department to take any and all steps necessary for the holding of the consolidated election.

4. The City of La Mirada recognizes that additional costs will be incurred by the County by reason of this consolidation and agrees to reimburse the County for any costs.
5. The City Clerk is hereby directed to file a certified copy of this resolution with the Board of Supervisors and the County election department of the County of Los Angeles.
6. The City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this resolution and enter it into the book of original resolutions.

RESOLUTION NO. 26-05

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF
LA MIRADA, CALIFORNIA, ADOPTING REGULATIONS FOR
CANDIDATES FOR ELECTIVE OFFICE PERTAINING TO
CANDIDATES' STATEMENTS SUBMITTED TO THE VOTERS AT
AN ELECTION TO BE HELD ON TUESDAY, JUNE 2, 2026**

A. Recitals.

- (i) Section 13307 of the Elections Code of the State of California provides that the governing body of any local agency adopt regulations pertaining to materials prepared by any candidate for a municipal election, including costs of the candidates' statements.
- (ii) All legal prerequisites to the adoption of this Resolution have occurred.

B. Resolution.


NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of La Mirada, California, does hereby resolve, declare, determine and order as follows:

1. Pursuant to §13307 of the Elections Code of the State of California, each candidate for elective office to be voted for at an Election to be held in the City of La Mirada on June 2, 2026 may prepare a candidate's statement on an appropriate form provided by the City Clerk. The statement may include the name, age and occupation of the candidate and a brief description of no more than 200 words of the candidate's education and qualifications expressed by the candidate himself or herself. The statement shall not include party affiliation of the candidate, nor membership or activity in partisan political organizations. The statement shall be filed in typewritten form in the office of the City Clerk at the time the candidate's nomination papers are filed. The statement may be withdrawn, but not changed, during the period for filing nomination papers and until 5:00 p.m. of the next working day after the close of the nomination period.
2. Pursuant to the Federal Voting Rights Act, the City is required to translate candidates' statements into the following languages: English, Spanish and Korean.
3. Pursuant to state law, the candidates' statements must be translated and printed in the voters pamphlet in any language at the candidates' request.
4. The City Clerk shall:
 - (a) Have all candidates' statements translated into Spanish and Korean.
 - (b) Have translated those statements into the languages as requested by the candidate.

- (c) Print all translations of all candidate statements in the main voter pamphlet. The main voter pamphlet will be in English, Spanish and Korean.
 - (d) Have all translations made available upon request in the office of the City Clerk.
 - (e) Have translations provided by professionally-certified translators.
 - (f) Allow bold type, underlining, capitalization, indentations, bullets, and/or leading hyphens to the same extent and manner as allowed in previous City elections.
 - (g) The City Clerk shall comply with all recommendations and standards set forth by the California Secretary of State regarding occupational designations and other matters relating to elections.
5. Each candidate shall:
- (a) Be required to pay for the cost of translating the candidate's statement into any foreign language that is not required as specified in Section 2 above, pursuant to Federal and/or State law, but is requested as an option by the candidate.
 - (b) Be required to pay for the cost of printing the candidate's statement in English in the main voter pamphlet.
 - (c) Not be required to pay for the cost of printing the candidate's statement in a foreign language required in Section 2 above in the main voter pamphlet.
6. The City Clerk shall estimate the total cost of printing, handling, translating, and mailing the candidates' statements filed pursuant to this section, including costs incurred as a result of complying with the Voting Rights Act of 1965 (as amended), and require each candidate filing a statement to pay in advance to the local agency his or her estimated pro rata share as a condition of having his or her statement included in the voter's pamphlet. In the event the estimated payment is required, the estimate is just an approximation of the actual cost that varies from one election to another election and may be significantly more or less than the estimate, depending on the actual number of candidates filing statements. Accordingly, the City Clerk is not bound by the estimate and may, on a pro rata basis, bill the candidate for additional actual expense or refund any excess paid depending on the final actual cost. In the event of underpayment, the City Clerk may require the candidate to pay the balance of the cost incurred. In the event of overpayment, the City Clerk shall prorate the excess amount among the candidates and refund the excess amount paid within 30 days of the election.
7. No candidate will be permitted to include additional materials in the sample ballot package.
8. The City Clerk shall provide each candidate or the candidate's representative a copy of this Resolution at the time nominating petitions are issued.

9. All previous resolutions establishing City Council policy on payment for candidates' statements are repealed.
10. This Resolution shall apply only to the election to be held on June 2, 2026 and shall then be repealed.
11. The City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this Resolution and enter it into the book of original resolutions.
