<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ 1,954 students and community residents participated in 86 workshops on the dangers of street racing across the County 	DYD & SRK
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ 80% said they were less likely to participate in street racing or a takeover in the future 	DYD & SRK
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Workshop location breakdown: SD 1 – 6, SD 2 – 41, SD 3 – 9; SD 4 – 23, and SD 5 – 7 ➤ Locations were concentrated in areas with high incidence rates; efforts are underway to increase activities in other areas of the County 	DYD & SRK

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Pursuing prosecutions against 2 alleged organizers of street takeovers 	LADA






