			Jerry Poon	<p>I live in Hacienda Heights and I am asking you to use every lawful County tool available to oppose or slow any Puente Hills Mall data center approval until there is full public scrutiny of the project's impacts on nearby unincorporated communities.</p> <p>I strongly support the April 14 motion on the health, environmental, safety, water, and electrical-rate impacts of data centers. Please make sure the County's analysis explicitly includes the proposed Puente Hills Mall site and the effects on Hacienda Heights and surrounding neighborhoods.</p> <p>My requests are simple:</p> <p>Treat this as a regional land-use and infrastructure issue, not just an internal City of Industry matter.</p> <p>Direct County Counsel to explore legal options if approvals move forward without full environmental review and cumulative-impact analysis.</p> <p>Demand clear disclosure of expected electricity load, required grid upgrades, backup generation, cooling method, water demand, noise impacts, and emergency-response implications.</p> <p>Protect County residents from cost-shifting of infrastructure upgrades and utility impacts.</p> <p>Federal and state analyses already show data centers are becoming major electricity users, and California legislators are actively trying to prevent data-center costs from being shifted onto ordinary ratepayers. That makes early County action urgent, not optional.</p>
