

CSC RESOLUTION NO. 26-01

RESOLUTION OF THE LOS ANGELES COUNTY CITY SELECTION COMMITTEE AUTHORIZING THE USE OF TELECONFERENCE MEETINGS AS AN ELIGIBLE MULTIJURISDICTIONAL BODY AND FOR ELIGIBLE SUBSIDIARY BODIES

WHEREAS, the Los Angeles County City Selection Committee (CSC) is established pursuant to Government Code section 50270 et seq., and is comprised of representatives from every city within Los Angeles County; and

WHEREAS, the Ralph M. Brown Act (Government Code sections 54950 et seq.) requires local legislative bodies to hold noticed public meetings, including the identification of any teleconference locations; and

WHEREAS, Senate Bill 707 (2025, Durazo) (SB 707) amended the Brown Act to authorize expanded teleconferencing options for eligible multijurisdictional bodies and eligible subsidiary bodies; and

WHEREAS, the CSC qualifies as an eligible multijurisdictional body under SB 707 because it includes representatives from more than one city within Los Angeles County and is otherwise subject to the Brown Act; and

WHEREAS, advisory groups, subcommittees, or task forces established by the CSC may qualify as eligible subsidiary bodies under Government Code section 54953.8.6; and

WHEREAS, authorizing teleconference options will improve participation, enhance transparency, expand public access, and support the CSC's regional governance responsibilities; and

WHEREAS, this resolution has been considered in an open and properly noticed meeting of the CSC.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Los Angeles County City Selection Committee:

Section 1. The CSC hereby finds that it is an eligible multijurisdictional body and authorizes the use of teleconferencing pursuant to Government Code section 54953.8.7.

Section 2. CSC established committees, advisory bodies, or subsidiary groups that meet the requirements for an eligible subsidiary body under Government Code section 54953.8.6 are authorized to use teleconferencing consistent with SB 707, subject to the required findings, approvals, and renewal requirements.

Section 3. Members and alternates may utilize teleconferencing only to the extent permitted by Government Code section 54953.8.7 and any other applicable Brown Act provision, including the applicable annual limits based on the body's meeting frequency.

Section 4. Pursuant to Government Code section 54953.8.6, the CSC finds that:

1. It has considered the circumstances of its subsidiary bodies;
2. Teleconference meetings would enhance public access and participation, and the public has been informed of the remote-access format and provided an opportunity to comment at an in-person CSC meeting authorizing remote participation;
3. Teleconferencing would support recruitment, retention, and diversity of CSC subsidiary-body members; and
4. CSC subsidiary bodies that meet the statutory requirements are therefore authorized to use teleconferencing pursuant to Government Code section 54953.8.6.

Section 5. Authorization for teleconferencing under Government Code section 54953.8.6 shall be reviewed and renewed every six months. Eligible subsidiary bodies must also independently approve the use of teleconferencing by majority vote and renew their teleconferencing authority pursuant to section 54953.8.6.

Section 6. Nothing in this resolution limits the CSC's use of other teleconferencing or remote-meeting provisions authorized under law, including traditional teleconference procedures, just-cause teleconferencing, emergency circumstances teleconferencing, or disability accommodations. Any unlawful provision shall be deemed severed.
